#### A CALL TO CHURCH PEOPLE.

Attention is specially directed to the importance of this election in view of the activities of the Cinematograph industry in seeking, through their nominees or otherwise, to secure the return of those candidates who will advocate the re-opening

of Cinemas on Sundays, and so reverse the existing policy of the Council. It is hoped every voter will consider it a duty to ascertain the views of the candidates in his or her district on the Sunday question, and how the present member has voted in the past. Our Sunday is a national asset; the day for Family Life and Religious Worship, and as The Rest Day is everyone's right. Any encroachment thereon, whether for profit or amusement, should be strenuously resisted. No other day can be an equivalent. The Sunday Cinema must, in fairness be followed by the Sunday Music Hall and Theatre, with lamentable effect upon the young life of the nation. The election is on March 8th. Many women have votes, and the influence of both sexes is earnestly asked for in opposing the commercialisation of the Lord's Day.
