The Thanksgiving Services in Church on July 6th were held after very short notice, but the large and devout congregation testified to our spirit of acknowledgment of the mercies of God vouchsafed to the nation and ourselves by this great victory for righteousness. I could not help thinking of the very many sad hearts in the village at whose cost the success has been won.

On Sunday, July 27th, at 4 p.m., the Church was filled at our United Service in which Mr. Shrewsbury and Mr. Goldie took part. It was a great pleasure to welcome a large number who do not usually worship in S. James. I am glad to say that the offertory was good (over $\pounds 9$), and was divided between the "Star and Garter" Fund at Richmond and St. Dunstan's Hostel for Blinded Soldiers.

As I announced last month Canon Brookes will be in charge of the Parish during August. Papers requiring his signature may be taken to the Vestry before or after the 12 o'clock services on every Wednesday and Friday.

We had a record attendance at the open-air C.E.T.S. Meeting in the Vicarage Field, on Wednesday, July 16th. Excellent arrangements were made by the usual band of helpers, and an interesting address was given by Mr. C. E. Boone.

I am grateful for the generous response to the appeal for supplying the necessary cups, saucers, etc. for use at Parochial gatherings. Miss Brewer is kindly making the final arrangements.

A very beautiful and useful copy of "Hymns Ancient and Modern" has been presented to me for use in Church by Mr. E. Makepeace. I acknowledge this kindly act with many thanks.

Every Parish in the Diocese is asked to send each year a named sum and Hampton Hill's quota for 1919 is £52. Each member of the congregation is specially asked to help this fund by a small regular contribution, for which envelopes' will be provided on application.

On giving up the charge of this fund, Mr. Poley has earned our best thanks for all the time and attention he has devoted to the work which is such an important part of our corporate life as Churchpeople in the Diocese. For the present the work is being undertaken by Mr. Carpenter.
