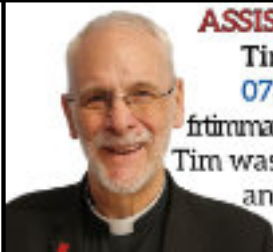

Lord of heaven and earth,
as Jesus taught his disciples to be
persistent in prayer, give us patience
and courage never to lose hope,
but always to bring our prayers before you;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

FIRST READING REVELATION 2: 18-29

To the angel of the church in Thyatira write:
'These are the words of the Son of God, who
has eyes like a flame of fire, and whose feet
are like burnished bronze: I know your
works—your love, faith, service, and patient
endurance. I know that your last works are
greater than the first.

'But I have this against you: you tolerate that
woman Jezebel, who calls herself a prophet
and is teaching and beguiling my servants to
practise fornication and to eat food sacrificed
to idols. I gave her time to repent, but she
refuses to repent of her fornication.

'Beware, I am throwing her on a bed, and those
who commit adultery with her I am throwing
into great distress, unless they repent of her doings;
and I will strike her children dead. And all the
churches will know that I am the one who
searches minds and hearts, and I will give to
each of you as your works deserve.

'But to the rest of you in Thyatira, who do
not hold this teaching, who have not learned
what some call "the deep things of Satan", to
you I say, I do not lay on you any other burden;
only hold fast to what you have until I come.

'To everyone who conquers and continues
to do my works to the end, I will give authority
over the nations; to rule them with an iron
rod, as when clay pots are shattered— even as
I also received authority from my Father.

'To the one who conquers I will also give the
morning star. Let anyone who has an ear listen
to what the Spirit is saying to the churches.'

GOSPEL MATTHEW 7: 12-20

Jesus said to his disciples, 'In everything do to
others as you would have them do to you; for
this is the law and the prophets.

'Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate
is wide and the road is easy that leads to
destruction, and there are many who take it.

For the gate is narrow and the road is hard
that leads to life, and there are few who find it.

'Beware of false prophets, who come to you
in sheep's clothing but inwardly are ravenous
wolves. You will know them by their fruits.
Are grapes gathered from thorns, or figs from
thistles? In the same way, every good tree bears
good fruit, but the bad tree bears bad fruit.

'A good tree cannot bear bad fruit, nor can a
bad tree bear good fruit. Every tree that does
not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into
the fire. Thus you will know them by their fruits.
