Ramblings from the Rectory

Well it's hard to believe that we are in February already and Christmas is just a distant memory. Even the visit of the wise men at Epiphany seems like a long time ago. The celebrations have come to an end for now and we need to find something new to celebrate but that's not easy in February!

Of course there is St Valentine's day for those of you who have a loved one to spoil but for some of us it will be just another day! The weather doesn't help with grey days, wind and rain and all around the ground is brown and dreary. There aren't many signs of new life around and we all begin to feel sad and lethargic. But the good news is that there is something to look forward to and I saw the evidence of it with my own eyes this week as I delivered my sermon to some of our flock who are not able to get to church.

As I approached one house, I had to look down to see where I was going and there in front of me poking through the soil were the tips of crocus' and beyond that the lovely white bells of the snowdrops were blowing gently in the breeze. On closer inspection there were signs of daffodils too and other plants showing green leaves which all confirmed to me that spring is on its way and with spring comes new life and new hope and a cause for celebration. We have had so much to deal with over the last 2 years that we need to know that there is hope for the future.

Isaiah 43:18-19 says "But forget all that—it is nothing compared to what I am going to do. For I am about to do something new. See, I have already begun! Do you not see it? I will make a pathway through the wilderness. I will create rivers in the dry wasteland."

And let's be honest we are definitely in need of rivers of hope in the dryness of this world!

And it is coming - Spring is on its way!

So now is the time for all of us to think about what that means for us. What can we do that will help us to feel better and fill us with hope and joy. Are there projects we have been putting off because of Covid or things left unfinished because we have been feeling a bit down. Now is the time to start thinking about them.

But it is not just about practical things we also need to consider our spiritual needs. How can we renew our relationship with God or at least strengthen it? We need to talk to God and just allow him to talk to us. Let this be the spring in your spiritual life too and let God help you to grow and flourish.

Philippians 4:6-7 say "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus."

Many years ago someone gave me some great advice and I would like to share that with you now. They said that if you thought about life like a jigsaw puzzle you wouldn't go far wrong. So here is that advice:-



1. Don't force a fit---if something doesn't fit properly it is because it is in the wrong place. Look at what you've got and find the place where it does fit.

2. When things aren't going so well, take a break. Everything

will look different when you return. It's no good getting frustrate with it just take time out and reflect.

3. Be sure to look at the big picture. The individual pieces are all important and necessary but they are not much good on their own. You need to have all the little pieces in the right order to see what it is you are looking at!

4. Perseverance pays off. Never give up! Every important puzzle went together bit by bit, piece by piece.

5. When one spot stops working, move to another. Don't get bogged down. But be sure to come back later (see #4).

6. The creator of the puzzle gave you the picture as a guidebook. Always remember that God knows exactly what the big picture looks like and he has all the pieces to make it happen you just have to keep asking him to show you.

7. Variety is the spice of life. It's the different colours and patterns that make the puzzle interesting.

8. Working together with friends and family makes any task fun.

9. Establish the border first. Boundaries give a sense of security and order.

10. Don't be afraid to try different combinations. Some matches are surprising.

11. Take time often to celebrate your successes (even little ones).

12. Anything worth doing takes time and effort. A great puzzle can't be rushed.

13. When you finally reach the last piece, don't be sad. Rejoice in the masterpiece you've made and enjoy a well-deserved rest... before moving on to the next one!!

I pray that your jigsaw is coming together nicely.
