Dear Friends

Whether the weather be wet, whether the weather be hot, We'll weather the weather, whatever the weather, whether we like it or not?

By the time you read this, we will have passed Midsummer's Day - how time flies! A year like no other (apart from 2020). I am glad to have seen some real rain fall on my garden and allotment in the last 24 hours, the first in weeks. We are fortunate in Britain to have plenty of rain, although it is uneven - there are droughts and floods. One of our prayer booklets this week said that the Sahara desert is gradually growing; Ethiopia and Kenya are particularly affected and the Fulani herdsmen of Nigeria are finding it hard to pasture their cattle, whose milk is drying up. On the other hand, many low-lying island nations in the Pacific are threatened by rising sea levels, caused by polar ice melting. Where will their peoples go? Will we see climate refugees as well as those fleeing injustice and violence?

Climate change is a reality and if we look ahead, it will affect all of us. We could become anxious or distressed about this but there still is hope, because there is plenty which we can do - as individuals, helping one another, as nations, as a world in union. But little spare time! The UK Government is committed to bringing down our national greenhouse gas emissions to "net zero" by 2050. And Kirklees is one of the many UK councils who accept that climate change is an emergency. 57 of those councils are bringing the date of "net zero" nearer - to 2045.

What about the Church?

Last year, the Church of England General Synod made a big leap forward. It decided that the Church and all that it is responsible for should be at net zero carbon by 2030. That means that our lifestyles as Christians, our impact on our local communities, our church buildings, our churchyards & land and our church services and Sunday schools all need to be looked at and for changes to be met. After all, our 5th Mark of Mission is "To sustain and renew the life of the earth".

We are already making a good start here in the Emmanuel churches! As a local church community, we are open to taking long term action to reduce our own greenhouse gas emissions. We have joined EcoChurch, a project run by the charity A Rocha. St Paul's Armitage Bridge has reached Bronze award standard and is on way to Silver award. Holy Trinity South Crosland has just started. Will they catch us up? Wait and see!! Their Environment rep Paul Roebuck-Rouse is onto it!

What does it cost? Certainly time - and there is software to learn about, so computer skills are needed - but only by a handful of people. Some money - for example gas boilers make a lot of greenhouse gases, whereas electrical heating, with electricity from green suppliers, makes no greenhouse gases. But there are grants available.



Climate Sunday

On July 18th, we are holding a special Climate Sunday service at 10am at Armitage Bridge and of course an online service too. It will be a climate-focused service to explore the theology and science of creation care, action on climate, and we will pray and (I hope) commit to action.

On September 5th, National Climate Sunday, all the commitments from churches like ours will be sent to our government so that they see how the churches are backing MP's in making good plans for a zero carbon future long before 2050.

If you have a computer, do look at the Climate Sunday website. And if you are interested in finding out what your own "carbon footprint" is, how about going to the World Wildlife Fund website and downloading their "My Footprint" app! It is good fun and will give you ideas about your lifestyle!!

During a very special service Paul Roebuck Rouse was baptised by the Rev Julie at Holy Trinity, South Crosland.






Book Review

The Treasures of English Churches – witnesses to the history of a nation By Matthew Byrne, Shire Publications, supported by National Churches Trust, f17.00

This book will be a sheer delight for anyone who enjoys the magnificent artefacts to be



found in our metropolitan cathedrals and remote parish churches. The wide range of stunning photographs include 16th century carvings on the choir seats of a village church to iridescent stained glass windows commemorating the Second World War, to ultra-modern art in Liverpool cathedral.

It is a rich selection of the best of our national church sculptures, stained-glass windows, church furniture and architecture. Together these artistic treasures trace the changing attitudes towards theology, politics and social life of Britain.

If you can't get out and about this summer as much as you would like, this book will provide you with a 'virtual' tour of many beautiful buildings.
