Saturday 5th Psalm 41, Jeremiah 36.1-18, James 5.7-end

Lord, sometimes we are aware of your presence in a way too deep to put into words, that we feel we could reach out and touch you. We long to know your arms around us, and to be known as your precious children and your valued possession.
