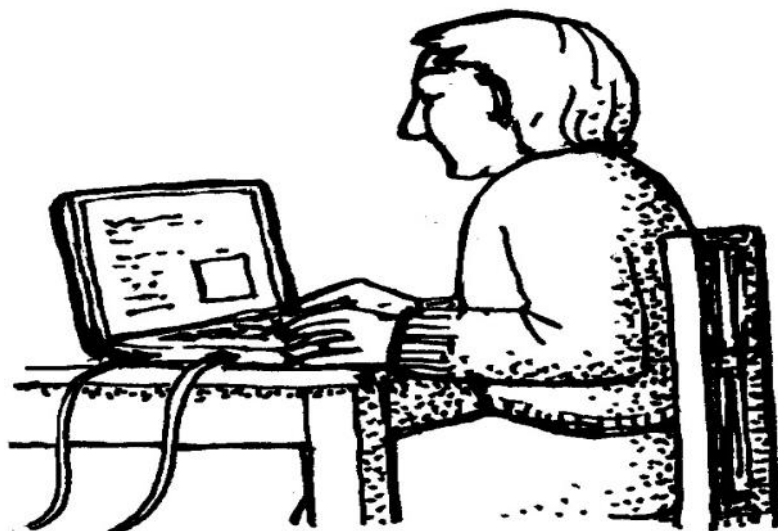
I am loving the sunny weather, rolling on the grass and warming my old bones, they have been a bit achy lately so I am trying new medicine, I think it helps a bit.

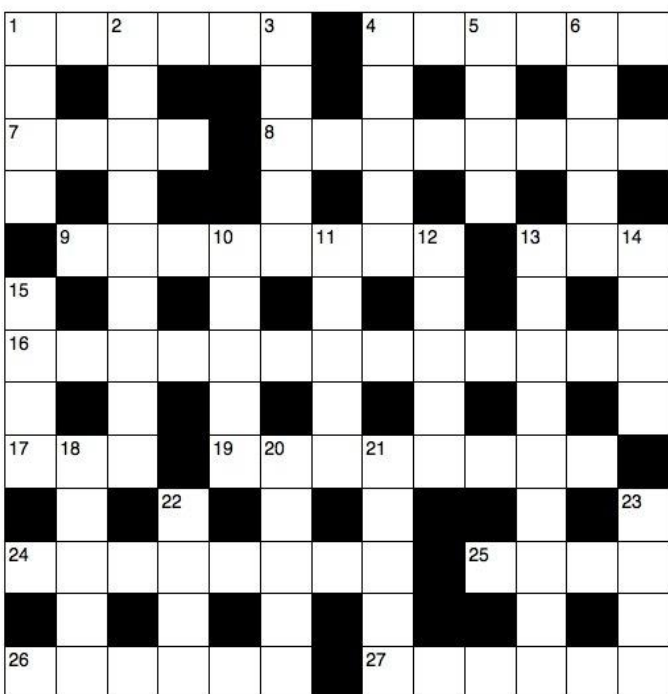
He has enjoyed baking bread during lockdown. If he can't find yeast he should try the Little Shop in Sole Street—they will get him some!
