Tribute to Michael Hodge

September '67 and a shabby Bedford van pulls up in Battle Street. From the driver's door emerges an exhausted man, his leg wrapped in plaster. He opens the passenger door as a woman in her 30's, holding a new-born baby, steps out. This 'Charabanc vision' announced the arrival of the new vicar- Michael Hodge and his wife Margaret. A few days later they are joined by Andrew's elder Sisters, Patricia & Rachel, and in January 1969 Susan Margaret completed the family.

Michael served in the parishes of Cobham & Luddesdowne until 1981, and became known by many as he regularly visited each home in the parish. Michael loved working with children and young people. His Bedford van took many teenagers out to Swanley swimming baths, Gillingham ice skating rink and countless other places, first as 'Oasis' and later under other youth group titles. When not out and about, these teenagers met at the vicarage for lively discussions and Bible studies, which led many to a personal faith in Jesus.

On the first Sunday of each month, Michael led the Family Service where children sat on hassocks and were treated to illustrated talks which appealed to children and parents alike. For the rest of the month Sunday School groups met throughout Sole Street and Michael, with his melodica, travelled to each group, leading the singing of action including his favourite, 'The Butterfly Song'. Songs and talks also featured at Cobham CE School where he took assemblies.

Cobham & Luddesdowne churches were always popular places for weddings. Michael conducted many, along with baptisms and funerals. Michael always tried to build relationships with those involved, often creating lifetime support and friendships, and was never happier than when he saw individuals taking steps to know Jesus for themselves.

Thursday was Michael's day off. Then he could be heard mowing the lawn in Battle Street all morning so that he was free in the afternoon to play hockey at St Georges CE School in Gravesend.

Over the years, Michael saw many come to a personal faith in Jesus and mid-week Bible Studies were always a highlight. Yet his care never stopped for all his parishioners and many testify to his support at difficult times in their lives.

Michael was involved in Synod at local, diocesan and national level. He served on General Synod for many years. Before taking Holy Orders, Michael studied mathematics at Cambridge and he put his skills to use in General Synod, calculating the dates of Easter until mid 22nd century. His keen legal mind and eye for detail was highly valued as was his sense of humour and humbleness.

In 1981 he moved to Bidborough near Tunbridge Wells; a smaller parish where he had time set aside for his growing role in General Synod. From there he retired to the Isle of Wight.

Michael continued leading services until he was 85. At that point he was unable to stand for long and led the services from a walking stick-seat.

His passion for working with children continued and he was an active member of Yarmouth's Messy Church team until the group closed not long before lockdown.

In later years Michael became 'wobbly' first of body and finally of mind. He retained throughout his deep personal relationship with Jesus, his deep and thoughtful prayer life, his sense of humour and true humbleness; his carers all loved him.

He died as he had hoped, by falling asleep and not waking up; he died on a palindromic date: 22.02.2022.

North Kent Embroiderers

Hello Everybody,

Today's talk and slide show was given by Mary Kitson, Museum Curator at the Fan Museum, Greenwich.; she focussed on fans from the mid 18th Century to the mid 19th Century and we learnt some fascinating information about the way fans were used. Often the decoration on fans of this period were used as a conversation starter. Consequently subjects covered included themes of a political nature. Mary told us about a variety of different fans, using the terminology 'sticks', 'leaf', 'guard' and 'gorge'. She explained how some fans were used by ladies to protect their faces from the heat of an open fire which would have melted the wax cosmetics in vogue at that time.

Fans have been in use for centuries; the Egyptians, Greeks and Romans all had their own styles of fans. In the UK The Worshipful Company of Fan makers is one of the Livery Companies of the City of London.; it was incorporated by a Royal Charter in 1709.

It was so good to have Mary with us to share the benefit of her knowledge and experience. Fans are of course, often an integral part of costume and its embellishment, so as embroiderers the talk was of great interest.






BELL RINGING by Peter Hartley

Weathering my first mild brush with Covid, I was snugly isolating in front of my television watching the broadcast of the Service of Thanksgiving for the Life of The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh from Westminster Abbey, when we heard the sound of the Abbey bells.

It is recorded that there were five bells in 1255 at the Abbey which were hung in a separate tower or campanile for 300 years. During the 16th Century, 6 bells were installed in the incomplete north-west tower of the Abbey.

By 1918 and the signing of the Armistice, the bells were almost unringable. The Whitechapel Bell Foundry were commissioned to cast a new ring of 8 bells and King George V and Queen Mary visited the foundry on 28th March 1919 for the casting of one of the new Abbey bells.

In 1971 Whitechapel cast a new ring of 10 bells (tenor 30cwt). The new bells were dedicated in the presence of The Queen on 9th November, when the bells were placed mouth upwards in the North aisle. Her majesty sounded the new 7th (the Elizabeth bell) by striking it with a special gold and ebony mallet declaring the bell 'sound and clear and of good workmanship'. Subsequently the bells were hoisted and hung in the tower and first rung on 10th December 1971.

The Westminster Abbey Company of Ringers, under the Dean, was reconstituted in 1921 and these very able ringers are responsible for ringing the bells as required on annual anniversaries, on great occasions and for special Services and events as required by the Dean. They do not ring for regular Services. When ringing for a special occasion, they only ring after the Service. But they do also ring before the Service when the Visitor (The Queen) attends. Unique traditions of this Royal Peculiar.

At the time of Prince Philip's death during a lockdown, when general ringing was not allowed, the Abbey tolled a bell 99 times on the day of death and again during the Funeral procession at Windsor. Exactly the same was done here at Cobham.

On Friday 3rd June the bells of St. Paul's Cathedral will ring for The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Thanksgiving Service. Bells are the soundscape of great occasions.

Summer is on its way!

As bulbs fade and herbaceous borders grow in leaps and bounds, it is now clear that summer is approaching. Sowing and planting out bedding can begin, depending on regional weather variations, and you can take softwood cuttings. It's also time to get back into the lawn mowing regime, as the lawn will be loving the warmer temperatures this month brings.

Here's the RHS Top 10 Jobs for May.

- 1 Watch out for late frosts. Protect tender plants
- 2 Earth up potatoes, and promptly plant any still remaining
- 3 Plant out summer bedding at the end of the month (except in cold areas)
- 4 Collect rainwater and investigate ways to recycle water for irrigation
- 5 Regularly hoe off weeds
- 6 Open greenhouse vents and doors on warm days
- 7 Mow lawns weekly
- 8 Check for nesting birds before clipping hedges
- 9 Lift and divide overcrowded clumps of daffodils and other spring-flowering bulbs
- 10 Watch out for viburnum beetle and lily beetle grubs

We are pleased to see so many of our members returning to our meetings, despite the current rise in Covid cases but we are still being very cautious.

In March, two of Kent County Council's Community wardens came along to tell us all about scams and frauds. They showed a video about an elderly gentleman who had been scammed by fraudsters into handing over money, which was a warning to us all. They did, however, give us some very useful tips and a reassurance that there is help available when needed.

It was not since 2019 that we had been able to hold our annual Spring Show, the one in 2020, for which we had all been preparing having sadly been postponed because of the lockdown. It was decided this year to split the show as it used to be, with the flowers, baking and produce part held in April and the Craft and Art part held in October, as our Autumn Show, thus giving us more space for entries. We were therefore a little worried that, because of the splitting of the two shows, current concerns about some people's reluctance to mix with large numbers of others and not knowing whether members would re-join, there would not be very many entries. We need not have worried at all. The Meadow Room was filled with beautiful flowers, floral arrangements (including one special class, to honour the Queen's Platinum Jubilee); the aroma of baking from the Victoria Sandwich cakes, savoury scones and Easter biscuits, and even more entries in the preserves section than in 2019.
