A letter from the Vicar, Rev'd Pam Davies

Dear Friends.

October is often a lovely month in my mind; the oft quoted season of "mists and mellow fruitfulness" but Autumn is coming early it seems this year. October brings with it many changes: Any last vestiges of Summer finally give way to Autumn; the trees start to darken as they approach their final drop; and the shops truly gear up for Christmas.

There are times in your life when change is inevitable, like when you have children. The importance of establishing a routine and some structure is quickly adopted. Mealtimes and nap times are sacred. Children thrive in a routine and when things change, when anything changes, they are quick to let you know they don't like it.

The same is often true for us, as adults. We don't like change either. We like things to be familiar and predictable. We like to know what to expect when we wake up each morning. But life is constantly changing. Children grow up, new grey hairs emerge every time we look in the mirror. We move house, change jobs, relationships end, and new ones start. All while our society changes its values

When such changes enter our life, it's overwhelming, confusing, even terrifying. We can go to bed at night to one reality and wake up to a completely different life. Change can make us feel lost and abandoned, like we've been tossed overboard in the midst of a storm. We're left reeling, trying to grab a hold of anything we can find that's strong and stable. We're tempted to run from change, as though we could ever escape it.

As we all encounter major changes in our individual lives, and as the world around us continues to change, we need a place to find hope. We need somewhere to stand when we wake up to news that a loved one has passed away, or our job is in jeopardy. The truth is, there is one thing that never changes, the one thing that stays the same: our unchanging God.

The Bible tells us that God never changes. "For I the LORD do not change; therefore you, O children of Jacob, are not consumed" (Malachi 3:6). There is no transition, inconsistency, or change in this God. The same God who created this earth is the same one who met Moses on Mount Sinai. The same God who forgave David for his adultery is the one who crushed his own Son when Christ became sin at the cross for us.

Yesterday, today, and forever he is the God who is "gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. The Lord is good to all, and his mercy is over all that he has made" (Psalm 145:8–9).

Because God never changes, his word never changes. All that he has said about himself remains true forever. Everything he has told us about why and how the world came to be, about what's wrong with the world, and about what he has done to save the world will never change. No matter what anyone may say, no matter who denies or defies God's word, it remains firmly fixed. "Forever, O LORD, your word is firmly fixed in the heavens" (Psalm 119:89). "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away" (Matthew 24:35).

And because his word never changes, his promises for us remain true: For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 8:38–39)

And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ. (Philippians 1:6)

Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand. (Isaiah 41:10)

The unchanging nature of God and his unchangeable word are real things on which we can stake our life. It is a rock big enough and strong enough for us to build a house on it, and an anchor big enough and strong enough to hold our souls in the midst of life's waves and storms.

Because of these truths, when everything in life seems flipped upside down, we can say with the psalmist, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear though the earth gives way, though the mountains be moved into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble at its swelling "(Psalm 46:1–3).

Things will continue to change — in the world around us and in our lives. Some of those changes will feel like a tiny ripple, and others feel like a tenfoot wave. But no matter what changes we face, we need not fear. We need not hide. We need not despair. Our rock and anchor is our unchanging God, whose character and promises remain fixed forever.

Hope to see you this Autumn.

BELL RINGING by Peter Hartley

August and bell ringers were on the move and at Cobham we were able to welcome three groups to ring our bells. I was happy to open up our tower, invite the ringers to sign our visitors' book, and talk about the history of our village, Church and College to those interested to look around between chances to ring.

The first group called themselves the Society of Rambling Ringers and on their annual ringing tour they were energetically ringing 6 towers a day for 6 days. There were ringers from Nottinghamshire, Lincolnshire, Oxfordshire, Yorkshire, Staffordshire, Lancashire, Durham, Bristol and Cornwall. From abroad was a ringer from Washington Cathedral and two from Dordrecht in the Netherlands, one of only a handful of European churches with bells rung in the English manner.

Next came ringers from Sheldwich and Selling in East Kent and they arranged to enjoy a day's ringing in about four North Kent towers.

Finally we were visited by the West Anglian Guild of Ringers (WAGS). Monthly on the third Wednesday they arrange to visit a couple of towers. This time they rang at Meopham, had a lunch in The Ship and then rang our bells. Most had ventured across the Dartford Crossing coming from Waltham Abbey, Witham, Bentley Common, Wethersfield, Felsted, Rayleigh, Chelmsford and Great Totham in Essex. Uniquely England has so many ringing church towers.

Little Tudeley Church outside Tonbridge has just three chiming bells but the remarkable treasure of the famed Chagall windows. In 1963 Sarah, daughter of Sir Mark and Lady d'Avigdor Goldsmid, was drowned in a sailing accident off Rye. The new window was installed in 1967 and was so admired that Chagall was commissioned to design windows for the rest of the church which were installed in 1974 and 1985. At long last visiting on a glorious sunny day in this country church I was bathed in the blues and yellows of this created watery world. As I came out of the church more visitors were arriving to dwell amidst this moving tribute to beloved Sarah.


