

### THE TWELVE DAYS OF CHRISTMAS



It is believed that the song dates from the 16<sup>th</sup> century and was used for children to learn the catechism during the religious wars. Each of the days had a hidden religious meaning. Thank you to Thelma for sharing this with us.

On the first day of Christmas; A Partridge in a Pear Tree.

Jesus is the partridge in the nest. Partridge mothers are very protective.

On the second day of Christmas; Two Turtle Doves.

The Old and New Testaments.

On the third day of Christmas; Three French Hens. Faith, hope and love or the three gifts of the Wise Men.

On the fourth day of Christmas; Four Calling Birds. Four Gospels that call people to Christ.

On the fifth day of Christmas; Five Golden Rings. *The Torah i.e. the first five books of the Bible.* 

On the sixth day of Christmas; Six Geese a Laying. The six days of creation.

On the seventh day of Christmas; Seven Swans a Swimming.
7 gifts of the Holy Spirit – Teaching, prophesies, service, giving, leading, compassion and exhortation.

On the eighth day of Christmas; Eight Maids a Milking.

The eight Beatitudes preached by Jesus – Blessed are the meek etc.

On the ninth day of Christmas; Nine Ladies Dancing. The nine fruits of the Spirit; love, joy, peace, patience, kindness etc..

On the tenth day of Christmas; Ten Lords a Leaping. *The Ten Commandments.* 

On the eleventh day of Christmas; Eleven Pipers Piping. The eleven apostles who remained loyal to Jesus.

On the twelfth day of Christmas; 12 Drummers Drumming. The Apostles Creed.

### The Letter of James

The New Testament mentions 4 individuals named James and it is probable that this letter was written by the brother of Christ and leader of the council of Jerusalem: Acts 15.13 and referred to by Paul as one of the 'pillars' of the Church in his letter to the Galatians 2.9. It is addressed to the twelve tribes scattered among the nations, and presumed to be written in the early 1st century for Jewish converts who met in synagogues. There are 3 main themes in this letter:

- 1. Concern expressed that his readers are not coping with their difficulties and trials in a Christian way by failing to rejoice through their lack of maturity in their faith
- 2.They are criticised for their loose tongues: 3.1 -12 by grumbling against each other with slander and quarrelling
- 3. The need to demonstrate their faith by good works i.e. action/deeds. James emphasises that to show their faith is genuine it must be demonstrated in their everyday life.

Initially this may seem contrary to Paul's assertion that a person is justified, i.e. put right with God (Romans 3.28) by faith. Paul teaches that works have no place in the initial acceptance with God, but James follows this up by maintaining in effect that works are the subsequent evidence of a justifying faith: What good is it, my brothers, if a man claims to have faith, but has no deeds can such a faith save him? Suppose a brother and sister is without clothes and food and one of you says to them 'Go, I wish you well, keep warm and well fed', but does nothing about their physical needs; what good is that? In the same way faith by itself not accompanied by action is dead: 2.14-17

The letter concludes (5.13-20) with instructions concerning, worship, prayer and confession e.g. if any of you is happy sing songs of praise If anyone is sick call on the elders of the church to pray over him and anoint him with oil......

James' letter is pastorally important in explaining the relevance of works/deeds in the Christian life that although scripture affirms that God will reward those who perform good works/deeds (see John 5.28) motivation is what is needed in that works are to be done for the glorification God rather for earning praise from other people!

Just look at the calendar! There is just a little time left before Christmas. Do you have all of your Christmas shopping done? I hope so, because the stores are really beginning to get crowded.

A few days ago, I had a few last-minute things that I needed to buy to finish up my Christmas shopping, so I got in my car and headed for the shops. That was a big mistake! The car park was full and I drove around for what seemed like an hour looking for somewhere to park. I was beginning to get a little bit short-tempered when I finally found a place to park. I went inside and the people were elbow to elbow. Why did I ever decide to come here so near to Christmas?

After pushing and shoving my way through the crowd, I finally found the items I needed and headed to the checkout. You guessed it! The checkout line was a mile long! 
### A BUSY WEEKEND AT MARYSTOWE - Memories of Harvest Festival



### Nature Notes by Bluebell - Dec. 2016 and January 2017



"The north wind doth blow,
And we shall have snow,
And what will poor robin do then?
Poor thing!
He'll sit in a barn,
To keep himself warm,
And hide his head under his wing.

There are several robins in Bluebell's garden, and they follow her closely, singing from the bushes and from the apple tree, waiting for her to disturb the ground to reveal a worm or other morsel, (as in days of old they used to follow herds of deer and boar in the woods, watching for these animals to scuff up the ground). Their sweet song is heard almost all through the year, except during the summer moult.

Each has his or her own patch. One is always alert near the bird feeder, one sings from the lilac by the back gate, one

goes tik-ik-tik-ik from amongst the ivy flowers near the washing line, and one haunts the holly tree overhanging the compost heap. Sometimes they fight. Males and females both hold fiercely defended territories. In mid-winter they are pairing up, getting betrothed, though not mating yet, preparing for the spring that is to come.

Recently, on two occasions, Bluebell has found a robin in her bedroom. Is this a search for the proverbial barn to shelter from winter's rages, or perhaps a hunt for the numerous ladybirds which squeeze in to the cracks in the window frames for the winter? There are many accounts of robins entering and staying in homes and churches.

There is something so endearing about this fierce little bird, with a lovely song and a brave red breast, often so friendly. Mutual affection between people and bird is well established, as in the story of St Mungo, in 6th century AD, of Glasgow, who brought back to life a robin, which had been killed, and which had been used to sit on the shoulder of St Serf of Culross while he prayed.

### **GARDEN NOTES BY DOUG, Digger's apprentice**

Hello! Doug here again.

If your equilibrium has been upset by trampolining boxer dogs, or the rather bright large moon, or you're wondering how on earth Michelle Obama's garden will cope when the new boy

takes over, sit down with a nice cup of tea and some seed and plant catalogues – it's that time of year. Christmas and mistletoe.

Mistletoe is a parasitic plant which attaches to and penetrates the branches of trees or shrubs by a structure called the haustorium. Through this it absorbs water and nutrients from the host. Most mistletoe seeds are spread by birds and are coated with a sticky material called viscin. Some viscin remains on the seed and if, or when, it touches a stem, it sticks tenaciously. The viscin soon hardens and the seed is firmly attached to its future host; there it germinates and its haustorium penetrates the sound bark. (thanks be to Wikipedia!)

"The pendant mistletoe, hung up to view Reminds the youth, the duty youth should do: While titt'ring maidens, to enhance their wishes Entice the men to smother them with kisses..."

Historically mistletoe was thought to have magical powers, providing protection against thunder, lightning and other evils as well as curing illnesses and guaranteeing good health. Much like Donald Trump, eh? So, look through those seed catalogues and see what ye shall sow next year. Last year I branched out a bit with dried flowers. I have raised helichrysums (straw flowers) in the past - they are so easy and when dried look superb over the winter months. This year I also sowed some Limonium (Statice) and Ammi Majus (Bishop's Flower). All very easy. Cut 'em off. Tie 'em up. Hang 'em upside down in the shed and Bob's your uncle Flowerdew.




