

Dear Friends in Christ,

I pray that as the South Tamar Mission Community begins the process to find your next Vicar, that you will each give of your time; both to God in prayer, praying that the right person will be found, and to each other in helping and supporting everyone in the time of waiting.

As I journey onward, I give thanks for those I have lived, worshipped and shared life with here for these past 9 years, the many people, places and communities whose fellowship has enriched, encouraged and taught me so much.

Our peace lamp was lit and the half-muffled tenor bell tolled 80 times. It was a sombre and reflective occasion.

The working group on 'heating and seating', to make St Mary's a more comfortable and welcoming space for both worship and community events, organised a public consultation in St Mary's on Saturday 13th of July.

A document outlining the proposed changes and an amazing digital model of what the church could look like was sent

out to the Sydenham Damerel community prior to the open meeting.

Our village book club as always provokes lively chat over wine and tea. Our next book is 'Lessons' by Ian McEwan.

A wonderful one-woman show, 'Squidge' was performed in the barn at Tuell, beautifully directed by Selwyn Hulme-Teague, on its way from London to the Edinburgh Fringe. We wish them well.



Nor would a ladybird know how many spots they had on their back. From then on, when a ladybird looks at another's back, it can tell whether that ladybird is trustworthy.

Likewise, when people show themselves to be dishonest other people paint spots on their impressions of them. It's enough to have just one black spot to change from a simple red insect into a ladybird. So, no matter what the prize may be, we should not allow anyone to paint that spot upon us.


At the recent meeting of the Benefice Pastoral Care Team on the 24th June, it was agreed that we should run a locally based Anna Friends Training Course in October. With Rev. Andy leaving and Rev. Phill holding the fort with support from Tim Thompson and Richard Searight, there was a recognition that many of our older folk, who can no longer physically attend our church services, should be supported as much as possible by our local lay people. Anna Friends work alongside Anna Chaplains (Annie Jefferies and Josie Whitfield) to offer varying degrees of spiritual support. This might be personal visits to people's home, telephone support or taking worship services in care homes.

All six of our churches have parishioners in their later years and when falls or illness make people housebound, we should have a flexible team who can visit these people at home. It would therefore be ideal to have one or two people from each church who might consider doing the Anna Friends course which is done over three training sessions of two hours each.

The course will cover:-

- what it means to be a good and focused listener
- the ageing process , grief and loss
- what is dementia and how can we meaningfully engage with individuals and their families
- how to select helpful Bible readings
- writing simple prayers
- offering people Holy Communion at home





GARDEN NOTES BY DOUG



Murder mysteries are a big thing on television whether you watch them or not.

So many people get murdered - in some places (St Marie; Death in Paradise?) once a week!

I'm thinking I could do with some help from those detectives who always solve the mystery...

I've been thinking for several months that this has been a standout year for slugs. Nearly everything has been attacked!

Particularly annoying has been the damage to my courgettes and sunflowers.

Now I'm beginning to wonder if it's not slugs. Aliens, maybe? Little beings from outer space dropping from the sky at night and shooting back as the sun comes up?



And, it seems, there are things they don't like and leave alone. Amaranthus (Love Lies Bleeding) is

one of those.

Planted alongside the sunflowers they're more or less untouched. These Amaranthus are strange - maybe brought by aliens to replace sunflowers and courgettes?

The flower spikes are long and floppy and the seeds provide a feast for the birds in the autumn.

They are also a bit of fun for the kids. They love to stroke the floppy flower stalk!



Meanwhile, in the greenhouse, the tomatoes are coming on (and the courgettes!). The toms' aren't quite there yet; maybe yours

have ripened ahead of mine?

They look as though they'll be really nice when they finally turn red.

NATURE NOTES BY BLUEBELL



"The first cuckoo I ever heard on a family trip out of London didn't just say: "I am a cuckoo"; it said: "Welcome to summer in the English countryside" p271 Charlie Elder;

While Flocks Last Bantam Press; London 2009.

"O Cuckoo shall I call thee bird, Or but a wandering voice?" To the Cuckoo: O Blithe New-comer! William Wordsworth.

When Bluebell's great-great-great grand-dam was a puppy, the sound of the cuckoo ("Thrice welcome, darling of the Spring!" *ibid.*) was a normal, common, well-known background sound in the country, like the twittering of masses of swallows gathered on the wires between telephone poles in September. What did swallows perch on before the invention of telephone lines?

Both are now sadly rare sights and sounds.

The cuckoo moved on to the Red List of endangered species in 2021.

It is only July, Midsummer: Lammas-tide, Harvest are to come, but the great Autumn Migration is beginning.

Soon the swifts that are screaming round Bluebell's roof on fine days will be gone, in the first week of August.

Then in September the swallows will gather and go. There was just one Swallow's nest in Bluebell's porch this year. The BTO has attached satellite tracking tags to some cuckoos, and these devices show that many cuckoos have already left the UK.

Irish Cuckoo, Cuach Torc, has hopped over the border from Bosnia & Herzegovina into Albania.

Next stop after Greece is Africa.

Sussex Cuckoo, Sayaan, is in Umbria in Italy; Norfolk Cuckoo, Cleeve, is in Aragon in Spain. Worcestershire Cuckoo, Severn, reached Spain but circled north-east over the sea, the Gulf of Lion, back into southern France, into the hills above Toulon! Suffolk Cuckoo, Wilfred, has crossed the Channel to France in Dordogne. Scottish Cuckoo, Henry, is in France, Val de Loire, and Scottish Cuckoo, George 2, is in Normandy. Norfolk Cuckoo, Cuthbert, has also flown over 200 miles across the channel to Normandy. Will he journey south-west via Spain, or south-east via Italy?

Irish Cuckoo, Cuach Cores, is close to the Italy-Switzerland border at Tirano.

Amongst the many dangers faced by migrating birds are the illegal mist nets on Cyprus, Malta and Mediterranean border countries which catch millions of small birds.

Shot, poisoned, snared, glued to lime sticks; about 25 million small migrating birds including blackcaps, quails and turtle doves, even house sparrows are killed, mostly illegally, every year.

Not one will fly again.

Many are destined for a speciality plate of pickled songbirds called "ambelopoulia".

RSPB and BirdLife.

Some laws are being put in place to protect the birds, but enforcement is weak.




