Dear Friends in Christ,

So, the summer is upon us and as I sit writing this letter we are enjoying what can only be described as rather "mixed bag" of weather. Some parts of the U.K. are even starting to experience water shortages, whilst others floods. Even though we have this beautiful weather now, I can't but help but feel a nagging thought, that as soon as the schools break up the rain will fall. We have all learnt that we can never predict what the Summer weather will bring. This summer though, I am discovering more and more, that whilst I may not be able to predict the weather, I can predict that God is there. Listening to my prayer and directing my path, my choices and decisions, my life.

A CHILD'S FOOTSTEPS TO FAITH

Peter Sinks on the Water

Do you remember the story in the Bible when Jesus fed five thousand people with just five loaves of bread and two fish? After he had finished feeding the five thousand, Jesus told his disciples to get into their boat and go to the other side of the lake while he went up into the mountains to be alone and to pray.

While the disciples were going to the other side of the lake in their boat, the wind came up and the water began to get rough. The disciples became afraid that their boat would sink and they would be drowned. Then they looked, and they saw Jesus coming toward them and he was walking on the water. When Peter saw Jesus, he became excited and he said to him, "Lord, if that's really you, let me walk to you on the water. Jesus answered Peter and said, "Come."

Well Peter climbed over the side of the boat and started walking on the water to Jesus. Then he began to look around, he felt the strong winds and saw the waves and he became afraid and started to sink. He cried out to Jesus, "Help, save me!" Jesus reached out


Dear Jesus, when the storms of life come against us, help us to keep our eyes on you and to put our trust in you. Amen.

Historically Christianity has often be associated with wars and violent division – like the Crusades

This view might be well supported by the teaching recorded Matthew 10:24 'Do not suppose that I have come to bring peace to the earth. I did not come to bring peace, but a <u>sword'</u> (machairan). Were the crusades a good thing after all – or were they just an awful misunderstanding?

Our Lord preached in Aramaic. However, the Gospels are written in Greek and then translated into our languages – so there were plenty of chances for 'Chinese Whispers' to take hold – unless 'context' is applied. This might be because translations of the Biblical text so often lack context.

In theology we were always taught to look at the context before going to the original Greek text. For instance, how could Our Lord say that 'I did not come to bring peace, but a sword' and then to say 'love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your Father in heaven.' (Matthew 5:43-45) Surely these teachings are a contradiction – but Our Lord did not 'do' contradictions. His whole life was steadfastly consistent.

So what does the Greek for sword 'machairan' actually mean? It depends in what context it is used. It can mean a weapon in the context of say a Roman soldier. However, 'machairan' used in connection with a religious teacher can also mean judicial judgement or dissension. We know that Jesus would never have used a physical sword. When he was arrested in the garden of Gethsemane Peter attempted to defend him by drawing his sword and cutting off a soldier's ear. Jesus healed him and announced that 'those who live by the sword die by the sword' (Matthew 26, 26:52) English speakers usually associate the word 'sword' with the weapon and yet the vast majority of biblical translations simply record Jesus saying 'I did not come to bring peace, but a sword.' rather than 'I did not come to bring peace, but dissension' so avoiding a contraction in Our Lord's teaching.

I would suggest that we all substitute the word *sword* with the word *dissension*. Our Lord would *never* have approved of the crusades.



St Peter's Church Wedding Kneeler 2023

A request was made to me in late 2022 to repair a few holes in this kneeler. In January 2023, two of us began to dismantle the kneeler to be able to consider and plan the way forward for this challenging project.

Many stitches had worn away, holes had developed in the canvas,



candlewax had been spilt onto it in several places and moths had left their chrysalises (and in some cases the remains of the dead insect). Once the base canvas was removed the foam was disintegrating leaving a lot dust on the underside of the canvas.

It took nine hours to dismantle completely and make a plan. This was

when we found the letter written by Dorothy Souter.

A new block of foam was ordered from a local company, together with tapestry wool as near as possible to the original colours, pieces of canvas to support the old and lastly foam covering.

I met with a friend from Tavistock most weeks for three hours to initially stabilize the original fabric and then to start


replacing stitches. Some afternoons we would make twelve new stitches only to unpick six of them as they didn't join with the original. The new pieces of canvas, although the same number of holes to inch, was much firmer than the old which made joining difficult.



The long side at the front was so badly worn, discoloured and so much had disintegrated, the best option was to cover it with fabric. The original is left underneath.

Finally, after seven months, we have able to reassemble the kneeler with Dorothy Souter's initials now on the front facing side. It has been an honour and privilege to restore to the best of my ability my dear neighbour, friend and mentor Dorothy, her wonderful piece of work. I hope I have given a few more years of pleasure to Lamerton parishioners.

NATURE NOTES BY BLUEBELL August - September 2023

"O Swallow, Swallow, flying, flying South,...
O tell her, Swallow, that thy brood is flown....
O tell her, brief is life but love is long,
And brief the sun of Summer in the North.

from The Princess, iv, Introductory Song; Alfred, Lord Tennyson

The wild flowers and grasses in a summer meadow are a litany of delight. And butterflies are on the wing now too.

A headline in the Times (4th July 2023) caught Bluebell's attention: **Pink Flowers that can help protect the climate from bovine burps.** Cosmos is one of a number of flowers which are "known to reduce methane emissions from livestock, especially cows, when

mixed with their food". Pink mosaic is a new variety of Cosmos flower, which was presented at Hampton Court Palace Garden Festival. Royal College of Art students designed a burp catching mask for cows (Daily Telegraph 22 April 2022) but it doesn't seem to have caught on.

Carbon dioxide makes up the majority of global greenhouse gas emissions but methane is the second most prevalent. It does not last as long as car-

bon dioxide, but has a warming effect many times more powerful.

Jonathan Sheppard, a lobbyist, gardener and expert on Cosmos flowers

asks why the flowers are not being trialled in feeding cows in this country. He offered to supply seeds to anyone interested in growing cosmos flowers to use in their cattle feed. Bluebell wonders if many of the other flowers in old-fashioned hay might help too.

The meadow flowers on Galford Down include Gorse, on the top stem of which sits a smart little stonechat, calling to another with a little chink chink like two pebbles knocked together. He has a black head, white half collar and russet breast. There are many grasses, filled like popcorn in a pan with leaping Common Green Grasshoppers, meadow pipits, rabbits; and the flowers include purple round-headed Prunella, or Self-heal, delicate yellow Tormentil, Rough Hawkbit, yellow Meadow Vetchling, Silverweed, Eyebright, Speedwell (Veronica Officionalis), and small thistles embraced by Clouded White butterflies. Through the grass float Meadow Brown and Hedge Brown or Gatekeeper butterflies, resting on bramble clumps.

Bluebell is delighted that a little brood of swallows is being reared in her front porch this summer again, and about 18 swifts are to be seen and heard in screaming parties round the house. Soon they will be flying South.

Free Fire Safety Check for your home

Did you know that Devon and Somerset offer free home visits to check on fire safety in your home?

Booking is very easy - see below

When booking a visit you will be asked a few general questions:

House or flat? Anyone over the age of 65 or 85 reside there? Anyone have a disability (mobility, learning difficulty, dementia) or suffer from poor eyesight or hearing?

Does anyone smoke?

Any gas or open fire appliances? Do you have smoke and carbon monoxide alarms?

The visit lasts about 30 minutes, where you expect to receive a check on smoke alarms, escape routes, extension leads and electrical sockets, state of your gas boiler or fire (if appropriate) - and if your carbon monoxide alarms are working.

The fire service will replace alarms free of charge, with a life span of 10 years.

People who are hard of hearing are particularly vulnerable and the fire service can offer vibrating pillows to alert someone who is asleep. They will also offer BSL signers and help with foreign languages to facilitate the visit.

Fire prevention is much easier to deal with than a fire!

GARDEN NOTES BY DOUG

Mary, Mary, quite contrary How does your garden grow? With silver bells and cockle shells And, pretty maids all in a row.

Well, Doug might have to get some silver bells and cockle shells, but he won't be allowed pretty maids (he certainly won't -

he's got his lovely wife instead) - unless they're just flowers. You may remember I sowed some annual flower meadow seeds in March; having stripped off the grass in autumn and covered the soil to stop weeds growing. Well, the result is a bit of a failure as you can see from the before and after photographs. I even had to add some nasturtiums for a bit of interest. So, what went wrong? Surely Doug couldn't have got it wrong? Well, I could blame the Met Office - good luck there, mate!





Sometimes - gardening - you just have to accept you get it wrong. It's inevitable. Sometimes you sow seeds and nothing appears. Sometimes you plant out a strong healthy plant and the next day the leaves have flopped and it never recovers. You have to accept the losses and enjoy the gains. Sow the seeds again - you'll score.

One reason I like growing from seed is that it is a cheap approach. It if doesn't work you haven't lost much and if it does you've won. Courgettes are a famous example. If you just hit it right, you sow a tenth of a packet and a couple of months later you're giving them away and/or chucking them on the compost heap.

The recent weather <u>has</u> been a nightmare. So hot, so dry, so wet, so cold. Everyone will have had trouble in their garden. Accept it's not like a jigsaw - you're never going to finish it, complete it, put in the last piece.

Have you thought about getting bulbs for a spring display? I'm thinking I'll order some camassias. The RHS says:

Camassia produce upright spires of star-shaped flowers in shades of violet-blue, white or pink...Camassia like moist (but not waterlogged) soil in full sun or light shade...Indian Americans traditionally used camassia as a food, where the bulbs were roasted and eaten as a vegetable, or boiled down into a molasses-like sweet.

Enjoy a lovely autumn.


