Important Building News

The cupola works were finished on Friday 4th December. On Monday 7th December our Architect Alex Veal inspected the works and found them to be good and passed them. On leaving the building Alex noticed stones and mortar lying near the front entrance on the ground. He looked up and was able to identify the area high up that the flint stones and debris had fallen from. The area concerned is shown in the picture on the left, with an enlarged view below left.

Alex has advised that it is likely that more stone and mortar falls are likely. At our Zoom service on Sunday, I showed everyone a few of the stones that had fallen and some of these are quite large. This obviously presents a danger to anyone going in or out of the main entrance, anyone waiting outside, or anyone using the side path. This does mean that, for health and safety reasons, we can't open the building as we are two entrances and exits down.

St. John's Church building will therefore remain closed until repair works are carried out.

The barriers will now need to remain in place until we get this problem area of the building seen to. In many ways, it is fortunate that most of the falls (as far as we can tell) have happened when the barriers were in place for the cupola works. These falls of stonework do not seem to relate in any way to the works that took place on the cupola and it looks like the area concerned is where some previous repairs have taken place. It looks like these repairs have failed.

I anticipate that it is most likely that the building will need to remain closed for the first three months of 2021. We are, of course, hoping to get the works finished well before the end of March but we also need to be realistic. Plans are already in formation about the repairs and I will share how we are progressing with you all in a future edition of 'The Online Link' early in 2021.

We lit the fourth candle to pray for hope.


Now we light the Christmas candle and we rejoice that Jesus is born. He is the love, joy, peace

Matthew 1:18-25

18 This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit.

19 Because Joseph her husband was faithful to the law, and yet did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.

20 But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit.

21 She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

22 All this took place to fulfil what the Lord had said through the prophet: 23 "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" (which means "God with us"). 24 When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. 25 But he did not consummate their marriage until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus.



Planning for a low waste Christmas

The amount of waste produced in our homes usually increases by around a third over the Christmas period and in just the few days between Christmas Eve and Boxing day we manage to rack up over 5% of our annual carbon footprint in the UK, making it one of the most wasteful and environmentally damaging times of the year.

But it doesn't have to be this way and as awareness of our impact on the planet grows so does the movement towards a greener Christmas, with more and more people making the effort to search out sustainable alternatives.

This year, Christmas may well be a quieter affair, with far fewer social gatherings and festivities, providing us with the ideal opportunity to rethink our Christmas habits and nudge us towards a low waste Christmas. Here are some hints and tips to help:

1. Choose recyclable wrapping paper or try making your own consider using reusable fabric, old magazines make great wrapping paper. Avoid using sticky tape try tying with ribbon that can be reused. Make your own gift tags from old cards.

2. Think about giving gift experiences or gift vouchers via email.

 Plan your Christmas meals (write up meal plans) to avoid food waste, try not to overbuy to minimise waste. If buying sweets or chocolates try refill packs if you already have tins or tubs.
When planning your Christmas table choose linen table cloths and napkins vs paper.

5. look for recyclable Christmas crackers or have a go at making them yourself.

News from A Rocha across the world- we are all united in our care of creation

Since its launch in July this year, A Rocha Aotearoa New Zealand has welcomed the first five churches to their Eco Church NZ network. It follows the success of the Eco Church award scheme pioneered by A Rocha UK, which now has around 3,000 churches registered across England and Wales.

Whilst the schemes differ slightly, the ethos behind them is the same: both aim to support churches to actively care for God's earth as an integral part of their mission. A Rocha Aotearoa NZ have articulated this as a response to 'three biblical challenges':

- 1. Living a faithful life and following Jesus through caring for God's earth.
- 2. Loving our neighbours in a resource-limited world whilst the earth's ability to support human life is being rapidly depleted, the poor will be the ones that suffer the most.
- 3. Reflecting and protecting the glory of God because caring for God's earth is an essential part of the church's mission in the world, churches can and should be agents of restoration and healing in their local communities. This includes modelling ways of living sustainably.

In partnership with *Para Kore*, A Rocha Aotearoa NZ has also launched a Zero Waste programme, which supports churches to reduce their waste through training workshops, resources and waste audits. The pilot began in August 2020 with seven churches in Christchurch and in March 2021, A Rocha Aotearoa NZ plans to expand this to churches in Auckland.



Praying for the Planet

It is good to remember our beautiful planet in prayer, meditation, awareness or involvement, with love, hope and gratitude.

We are about to witness an exciting planetary alignment when Jupiter and Saturn appear so close together in the sky that they seem to merge. It will be on the solstice, December 21st, so two important planetary events on the same day. They have not looked as close as this for nearly 800 years. Some believe that their alignment in 7BC was the star of Bethlehem followed by the magi at the time of Jesus' birth, and another name for this conjunction is the Star of Bethlehem or the Christmas Star.

To see them, look above the south-southwest horizon about 45 minutes after sunset. You can start looking now to see them moving closer, and then moving apart again after the 21st. Jupiter is the brighter of the two. *Jane Upchurch*



St John's

The church has a number of brasses, the best of which is the Le Strange Brass, dated 1509. It is said by Pevsner to be the most ambitious brass of the Middle Ages to survive in Greater London. It represents John, eighth Lord Strange of Knockin with his first wife Jacquetta, daughter of Richard Woodville. Her sister, Elizabeth, was Queen of Edward IV and mother of the Princes who were murdered in the Tower. Lord Strange died in 1479 (his wife predeceased him) and was buried in Hillingdon Church.

Saint John the Baptist, our patron Saint, was born when his parents were elderly. He prepared the way for the coming of Jesus. The window in the south wall of the chancel, based on the idea of the tree of life, shows episodes in his life. He was always truthful, even though this led to him being beheaded.

The church is not a museum, but a living church serving all who live in the parish and those from outside who wish to worship here. People have come to our church for over 800 years for the baptism of their children, to be married, and for the burial of their dead. *Christine Bartlett*

The Children's Society Home Coin Boxes.



CHURCHES, households, schools, and businesses in the UK are being invited to take part in a new "bin-twinning" campaign to support <u>waste-collection projects</u> in Haiti, <u>Pakistan</u>, and <u>Uganda</u>.

It was launched this month by the Christian charity <u>Tearfund</u>, which also founded the "toilettwinning" campaign to improve sanitation in developing countries. Participants are being asked to donate £45 towards the projects, in exchange for a "bin twin" sticker for their bin.

"As Christians, we're called to be good stewards of God's creation; so reducing our waste footprint should be part of our response, especially as so much UK plastic ends up abroad. We hope twinning their bin and seeing the Bin Twinning sticker will help people become more mindful of how much waste they generate, as they support innovative start-ups tackling the waste crisis overseas."
