You might have seen the letters 'C+M+B' with numbers either side of it above a door. Some people stick or chalk this number and letter combination above their doors at Epiphany, early in the new year, and keep it up for the whole year. The numbers are for the year that has just started, so now we are in 2022, the numbers for this year are 20 and 22, so it is 20+C+M+B+22.

At Epiphany, we remember the Wise Men visiting Jesus with their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. Their names are thought to be Casper, Melchior and Balthazar. The letters C, M, and B represent their initials, but these letters also stand for '*Christus Mansionem Benedicat*' which means 'Christ Bless this House'.

We put this above our doors as a prayer, so that when we see it, we remember to pray. Our prayer is to ask God to bless our room or our home, to bless our goings out and our comings in, and to bless our conversations in this place. It is also asking God to bless others through us as we go out from our home or as we welcome them in to our home.

As I write this, we are unsure if there will be more restrictions this new year thanks to covid! But even without extra restrictions, this pandemic has made our going out more limited. Yet this can still be our prayer. We can pray for God to bless and protect us when we do go out. We can pray for God to bless and protect those who deliver food or bring essentials to our door for us. We can have this over the doors to the rooms in our home, and we can pray for God to bless us in our home and to give us his peace in each room.

This year, let this number and letter combination help remind us that Christ is with each of us in our homes, in all that we are going through individually and that he is also with us as a nation and globally.

Our prayer for you is that God will bless you and that the peace of Christ will fill your home.

So join us this year with 20+C+M+B+22. As we pray, '*Christus Mansionem Benedicat*' in 2022, may Christ bless each of our homes every day of this year. **Anne Bradford**

On a pre Christmas outing to Great Missenden I went to St Andrews christian bookshop. They have a large selection of books including many secondhand. I came away with 3 books coming to the grand total of £2.20 so saved money and I'm reading recycled books!


They are all providing much needed input at this time. The first is called 'The Eye of the Needle' by David Adam, a meditation on 'Be thou my vision'. The words and practices suggested have been helpful with where I am at the moment with my life.

Another is 'Saying yes to life' by Ruth Valerio. This was the Archbishop of Canterbury's lent book for 2020, which some of you may have read. It may not be lent but the author heads each chapter with a verse from Genesis. Each chapter looks at an aspect of creation, our concerns on the environment, and on social and ethical matters.

My third choice was 'Waiting on God' by Simone Weil, who was a French philosopher, mystic, and political activist. I have chosen this to find out more about her life, but it is also providing food for thought.

At Christmas I received 'A Warning from the Golden Toad' by Tim Flannery who is an Australian palaeontologist, conservationist and writer. Its only a small book and is one of a series from penguin on green ideas. So I have plenty to read and to start my journey with into the new year. **Happy New Year.** *Christine Rodrigues*

The next gravestone on the floor of the church is at the end of the North Aisle just before the Toddlers Corner. The stone is very worn but thankfully we have a transcript of the wording, which reads as follows:

Here rests the body of John Parsons of this town and Daniel his son the son died November 27th 1702 aged 19 years the father died May 19th 1703 aged 48 years

Father & Son do thus together lye

Let young and old prepare to dye

There is not much more information about this family other than we know that they were butchers, but we can assume they as they were buried under the floor of the church building, they were well respected and wealthy. *Christine Bartlett*




John and Daniel Parsons Gravestone.

Services

Update: If you are joining us in person we have the following in place to help protect against the spread of Coronavirus:

-Lateral Flow Testing: Please take a lateral flow test before attending our services. This is a precaution to make sure that you are not asymptomatic. If you feel unwell and have any of the coronavirus symptoms please stay at home and request a PCR test.

- **Masks:** You are required to wear a mask inside the church and when singing unless you are exempt. If you are exempt you should have an exemption card and wear this on a lanyard so that others are at ease. Masks are available at the entrance to St John's. However you may wish to use your own mask.


- **Hand sanitiser:** This is available when you enter and at various locations inside St. John's, although you may wish to bring your own.

Some of you may have noticed that the Cedar tree has had much more work done. (As you will see in the below pictures!)


The tree surgeons attended on the 22nd December bright and early. It was a warm, clear day for December, with no wind. Ha! Ha!
