'Always be prepared to Answer!

It has been great hearing people sharing about their faith journeys as part of our "Conversations of faith with " series on Sundays.

Each person who has shared about their faith journey has been asked the same questions and I

thought it would be useful to reproduce the questions here so that you could answer them for yourself!

In answering the questions we were, of course, not looking for 'perfect' answers of great success! We are not looking for all doom and gloom either! We are encouraging everybody sharing to just be 'real' and tell it as it is in a way that is an encouragement to others. We don't all always have 'perfect' answers to prayer neither, nor a perfect pattern to our testimonies and we have all suffered and had embarrassing times and hard times with doubts. These all provide another way that Father God has ordained through circumstances to mould and transform us to be more like Jesus. So here are the questions:

- 1. Where were you born and where did you grow up?
- 2. Did you have any awareness of God as a child?

(It is absolutely fine to say 'no' as that is true of many. Alternatively you may have had some awareness that was difficult to put into language)

3. What influenced you at the beginning of your journey of faith?

(This could be the main and significant places, events, people, education that have influenced you to come to faith. Note: this is not meant to imply from the beginning of your life necessarily. Many have only had influences from a later place in their life that have led to owning a personal faith)

- 4. Is there anything that led you to a growing awareness of faith on a more personal level?
- 5. Did you find yourself making some sort of commitment to God? How?
- 6. Is there anything you can share about your faith journey that will encourage others in their searching or faith journey?

I hope you will find these questions helpful in thinking about your own journey. Certainly, the Bible does encourage us to be prepared to speak about our faith and the hope that we have:

"Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. " 1 Peter 3:15

Do let me know if you need help at this current time in your journey or if you have any questions about the faith.

Ephesians2:1-10

How Much Paper Comes From One Tree?

Many organisations try to achieve the goal of a paperless office.

Going paperless not only helps with the environment by saving the number of trees being felled, but can also help an office become more efficient. With less need for physical files which can often become hard to manage, causing confusion! Ever had that feeling of I remember seeing it now what did I file it under!! Paper files can also take up much needed space.

But just how much paper comes from one tree?

It is hard to calculate this as paper often uses a mix of different trees types. The majority of paper used for offices comes from the Pine tree. Of course trees will always vary depending on age, environment and type of tree.

A standard Pine tree, with **45ft** of the usable trunk and a diameter of eight inches will produce around **10,000** sheets of paper. consider this in another way one ream of paper (**500** sheets) will use **5**% of a tree! most small energy efficient offices will use the equivalent of 1 tree per year! That tree would be **20-30 years old!**

Recycling is great, but there is an increasing need for paper.

So lets have a think about the journey we have been on at St John's Christine and Alan had already started our Journey in becoming more paper efficient. So I eagerly took over this quest. 3 years prior to the pandemic we had saved **160** sheets of paper per week just from Sunday services. That's **8,320** sheets of paper per year! Saving **24,960** sheets of paper over 3 years. Alan's introduction of the screens has helped us to reduce the need for the words of the hymns.


Here are just some examples of what we have introduced at St John's:

- -Going paperless for our invoices. Opting to use the app or have them emailed. St John's Gas bill alone was often 10-12 pages in total!
- -We buy recycled paper and we recycle all paper in the office.
- -When we need to print we print on both sides.
- We use online banking where possible and encourage other organisations to do the same.
- -We use the scan facility on the printer or email for any documents we ask from others and save to the computer rather than print and file this also helps keep your data as safe as possible allowing us to delete when no longer needed.
- -The Online Link is a great way for us to communicate news to you. We can add links to events and further information that are just a click away. If you are away you can always keep up to date with all the news.

There are many more paper saving initiatives that we have implemented if you would like to know more I would be happy to share these with you. There are many more ways we could improve...

What one thing could you do differently as a result of reading this?

The Heming Dynasty

A memorial plaque next to the organ in St John's leads us into the story of the Heming family covering several generations represented by 7 memorial plaques dotted around St John's and one family vault outside in the churchyard. Ken Pearce has kindly provided me with a family tree for the Hemings which has been very helpful.

The first Heming to settle in Hillingdon was Thomas Heming. He was a royal Goldsmith, and in fact one of our 17th century chalice's was repaired by him in 1780. Thomas Heming died in 1801 and his memorial is in the South Aisle. Nearby is a memorial to Thomas's son George and his wife Ann.

In the south transept the stained glass window was dedicated to the memory of Richard and Harriett Heming and their son Thomas. Richard was the brother of Thomas mentioned above, his gravestone is in the south aisle near the café area but it is very badly worn and so the inscription cannot be read.

Also remembered on a brass plaque in the south transept are the 5 daughters of Richard and Harriett: Mary Ann, Harriett, Eleanor, Henrietta and Ann. Outside in the churchyard just the other side of the south aisle wall is where they are buried. I am particularly fond of this gravestone, the inscription is carved beautifully and snowdrops bloom around it every year in early spring, which are such a joy to see.

A plaque next to it tells us that the organ was purchased in memory of John Garratt. He married into the Heming family who lived at the Manor House (where The Crossway is now). John Garratt's wife Ann (daughter of Richard and Harriett) has her own memorial plaque in the South Aisle near to other members of her family. John and Ann lived at Bishop's Court in Devon. Their son Lt Colonel John Arthur Thomas Garratt inherited the Heming wealth and became the principal landowner in Hillingdon. He was married to Georgina De Salis.

In the nave aisle there is a monument to Mary wife of the first Thomas Heming and it bears this motto in latin which translates as "either do it perfectly or do not attempt it at all" I'm not sure I agree with this sentiment, and I think my motto would be "the most important thing is that you do your best". What would your motto be? *Christine Bartlett*

Please remember to wear your face masks.


