The Greeting

SETTING 968

Sing glory to God in the height of the heavens,
salvation and peace to his people on earth;
our King and our Saviour, our God and our Father,
we worship and praise you and sing of your worth.
Creation unites in the power of the Spirit,
in praise of the Father, through Jesus, the Son.
So complex, so simple, so clear, so mysterious,
our God ever Three, yet eternally One.

Our Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,
Lord God, Lamb of God, by the nations adored,
your blood takes away all the sin of creation:
Have mercy upon us, for whom it was poured.
For you are our Saviour, our only Redeemer,
who came all our gladness and sorrows to share:
you sit at the side, the right hand of the Father,
have mercy upon us, and answer our prayer.

For you, only you, we acknowledge as holy,
we name you alone as our Saviour and Lord;

Either one or two readings from Scripture precede the Gospel reading.

At the end of each the reader may say

This is the word of the Lord.
Thanks be to God.

Stand and face the altar

**We believe in one God,
the Father, the Almighty,
maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is, seen and unseen.**

**We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God,
eternally begotten of the Father,
God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God,
begotten, not made,
of one Being with the Father;
through him all things were made.
For us and for our salvation
he came down from heaven,
was incarnate from the Holy Spirit
and the Virgin Mary and was made
man.
For our sake he was crucified under
Pontius Pilate;
he suffered death and was buried.
On the third day he rose
again in accordance with the

the living and the dead,
and his kingdom will have no end.**

During the distribution hymns and anthems may be sung.
