What is the Mission of the Church? Simply put it is to preach the gospel of Jesus, to make disciples of all those who respond, and to encourage one another in our faith. Jesus said to His disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few." (Matthew 9:37 NIV). For a very long time the understanding has been contrary to scripture, that the work of the harvest is the work of the few, the special few. Jesus goes on to say, "Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." (Vs38) If the church is to continue and complete her mission, then it requires more people becoming involved in this mission. Remember the war posters, "Uncle Sam Needs YOU." We need you, if we are going to complete the task.

If you do not become involved in the various roles and ministries, then we will not reap the harvest. And either the harvest will be lost, or someone else, not necessarily another Christian church, will reap the harvest. There are many seeking to gather the harvest of souls in.

So think about your role. Are you going to be responsible for the salvation of and nurture of souls? OR, and it is a big or, are you going to be responsible for souls being lost to the Kingdom of God because you could not be bothered to be sent by the Lord into His harvest. The ones we leave it to today, may not always be there to gather the harvest. Think about it.
