Rector's Reflection

Today is Advent Sunday and it marks the beginning of the Season of Advent, the first season in the church's liturgical calendar. Advent is a time of preparation, thinking about the return of Jesus. But instead of this quiet period of preparation Advent has become a vast wheel of Christmas related frenzied activity. Nativity plays, shopping, festive food, Christmas meals and parties begin as early as November.

This year, can I invite you to make a deliberate decision to move away from the hustle-bustle consumerism that now marks this season, into the peaceful, joyful anticipation given to us in the traditional Advent when we listen to the Biblical story of the Coming King just as we will celebrate His birth among us on Christmas.

In the public space the world only thinks of Christmas, but let us reclaim the season of Advent in our homes with our children and our grandchildren. This year can I encourage us to observe the season of Advent with both celebration and meditation on the second coming of Jesus. Whatever you seek to do let it be unified by the underlying theme of celebrating the coming of Our Lord.

Celebrating Advent in the home does not need to be a large production but suitable to the home and family. Celebrate small! Let us give ourselves permission to move away from the "Christmas crazies," to celebrate in a fuller, richer, more meaningful, manner. I'd encourage you to make your Advent observation more purposeful while not becoming overwhelmed with a to-do list. Simply lighting an advent candle with a prayer, maybe a brief Bible reading, have an Advent Calendar that has the Christmas story not chocolates. Celebrate the hope we have that Jesus is coming soon. How can we prepare our families for Jesus return? By sharing and learning with them through the season of Advent the promise of God's Word.
