

The proceeds of all ticket sales go to the charity 'Freedom from Torture', (Registered charity: England 1000340).





## COMMUNITY COOKBOOK

Our first recipe comes from Jean Young.



### FILLED PASTA SOUP

Serves: 2 (but easily doubled)

286 calories (fat: 9g) per serving.

#### INGREDIENTS:

1 dessertspoon olive oil.

1 chopped carrot.

1 small, chopped onion.

500ml/generous  $\frac{3}{4}$  pint of made up vegetable stock.

Half of a 400g can of peeled tomatoes with garlic.

100g/4oz frozen mixed peas and beans.

Half of a 250g pack of filled pasta e.g. tortellini.

A few chopped basil leaves (optional).

Finely grated cheddar/parmesan to sprinkle the top.

Crusty bread to serve.

#### TIPS:

Buy 250g packs of filled pasta (e.g. meat or cheese) and split into single portions and freeze in small bags. Be on the lookout for 2 for 1 special offers.

Substitute plain pasta, such as macaroni or penne, if preferred.

Using cheddar cheese instead of parmesan is cheaper, but use the fine side of your grater.

Use packs of frozen chopped onions, carrots and other veg.

Adapt ingredients to your choice!

## **METHOD:**

- 1. Heat the oil in a saucepan and fry the carrots and onion for 5 minutes to soften.**
- 2. Add stock and tomatoes, simmer for 5 minutes.**
- 3. Add peas and beans and simmer for further 5 minutes.**
- 4. When vegetables are tender, stir in pasta, return to the boil and simmer for 2/3 minutes according to packet directions.**
- 5. Stir in basil, season, and serve in bowls topped with cheese.**
- 6. Enjoy with crusty bread or freeze individual portions for later.**
