GOOD NEWS from John Fell

We have recently met with our architects and the successful tender for constructing the ramp.

Gary Collier and James Beddow of Mono Masonry were the lowest tender at just on our budget of £30,000. They come highly recommended by our architects and have experience of working on major projects at Emmanuel during their time at Lloyd and Smith. They hope to start work early October with completion hopefully weather permitting end November. The usual entrance up the steps to the main door will consequently be out of use. ENTRY to the church will therefore be by the NORTH PORCH ie.the current ramp entry point and EXIT as at present by the MEMORIAL CHAPEL DOOR. You may recall that we were generously awarded a grant of £5000 by the Harris Charitable Trust and we have also earmarked Roger Ost's legacy of £5000 with the balance coming from the remainder of Barbara Gorman's legacy and the Mission fund. Those who have had the chance to see the plans will be as excited as we are to see the finished product which will we believe enhance the entrance to the church in time for Christmas and indeed make the church building easily accessible to everybody


