From the Rectory

We have lived in Reedham for a year now and still we feel amazed at the beauty of the place, especially the marshes. There is also something extra special about travelling between the eight churches of our new benefice. The countryside around changes so much as the summer progresses and the season moves into autumn.

Recently I was given a poem about Reedham and it came as no surprise to me to find that this area and these villages have been loved and appreciated for a long time. The poem was given to me at a Service for the Burial of Ashes of a Reedham villager, Paul White. Mark White, his nephew, found it in Paul's grandmother's bible. Here is the poem, written by A. Youngs. Does anyone recognise it?

Preaching simply, You, not I.*

*May we always stick together,
Young and old united stand,
Aim to make our little village
Such a pleasant spot and grand.*

*See the best in one another,
Seeking help from God above,
Living out our lives in service,
Following Him, whose name is love.*

As we plant our flowers for Winter and Spring, think of the bees and butterflies with heathers, wallflowers, pansies and bellis interplanted with bulbs. Keep ponds clear of leaves which can rot and poison the water.

Looking forward to Spring, broad beans and garlic (especially purchased and not from the kitchen) can be planted. Tomatoes can be ripened indoors. Apples, such as Bramleys and Coxes, can be stored in a cool, frost free place carefully wrapped in newspaper, so they do not touch each other.

Reedham Parish Council - Meeting held on Monday 5th September 2016

There were 8 Councillors present and the outgoing Clerk Brenda Hoskins and the new Clerk Claudia Dickson. Also present were County Councillor Iles and District Councillor Nurden. 6 members of the public were present. Council meeting commenced at 7.30 pm

County Councillor Iles informed the meeting Devolution was unlikely to proceed. The County has no money to help reopen the permissive path. The new spur on the Postwick roundabout has been completed in time for the new school year.

District Councillor Nurden informed the meeting that Head of Environmental Services confirmed the project for Reedham Quay is still forging ahead. The consultation on the Devolution Deal has closed and a report will be presented to BDC this week. He brought the Handyperson + service to the Council's attention which offers help and advice to anyone over 65 with small household repairs and minor adaptations. The permissive path could be reopened if the landowner is reassured that the path is covered by Public Liability Insurance, he receives a small token payment for the nuisance calls he has received, and the maintenance of the path should be at no cost to himself.

The Chairman of the Village Hall Committee Chris Bradbury gave the following report:

There are no issues with the play equipment following the inspection in August. Still waiting to hear regarding the installation of fibre optic broadband with BT.

The Village Hall has signed up for a free online ticketing system. To find out more visit the website or TicketSource.

Fund raising:

August bingo jackpot was not won therefore now stands at £230.

The next films are the new Jungle Book on 26th October and Absolutely Fabulous on 16th November.

On 23rd September there will be another Murder Mystery, "The Christening". It starts at 7.30 pm, tickets £5 including food.

Further comments:

Resident of Pottles Lane complained that he had written to Highways regarding the state of the road but had not had a reply. County Councillor Iles to investigate.

Councillor Lester had written to NCC regarding the possibility of listing the swing bridge but although it might be considered a Heritage Asset there was nothing recognisable to give it a listing. Network Rail have no plans to close it

Councillor Silverstone was concerned that BDC are cutting an area of grass belonging to the Nelson.

The purchase of benches for the play area and a tractor for cutting the football pitch and field was discussed. Prices for both to be obtained and discussed at the next meeting.
