From the (Reedham) Rectory

I am writing this on the first day of Lent. No doubt many of us will be thinking about what we can give up for the next forty days, what really nice thing we can do without. It is really encouraging to me that so many people still do this. Sometimes I have, instead, decided to do something extra each day and, this year, lots of people are doing that – they are choosing to Live Lent. Live Lent is a book or a mobile phone app: <https://www.chpublishing.co.uk/apps/live-lent> and I have got the app on my phone. Each day there is a reading from John's Gospel and a reflection so that, every day of Lent you can take some time – just a few minutes – to reflect on the story as we come toward Easter. That said I am determined to try and give up chocolate too, but I don't manage every year to last out until Easter! Now I've told everyone so I shall have to make it this year.

A part of today's reflection for Lent is worth sharing with you. *'The Gospel of John begins with words about life. The beautiful diverse and fragile life of creation. The personal, precious and complex life of our own existence. All this is a gift, spoken into being by God through Jesus, the Word. The life we live is not always beautiful or easy. It is often dark. As we see within it the gift of God and the beauty of God, we discern a light that shines brightly and can never be put out.'* I sit back and think about that and then, as Live Lent suggests, I look around for the signs of life around me and say thank you.

This year, as I have just returned from Jerusalem and staying in Bethlehem, the Easter story that we are approaching seems so much more real. Last week I walked the long uphill walk through the city of Jerusalem on which Jesus walked carrying his cross. It was a hot day and the streets around us were crowded just as they will have been when he walked there. Even being right there, where it happened, it was hard to imagine how awful it must have been for him. Much has changed in that city over the last 2000 years, but so much stays the same. Jesus was born in Bethlehem and spent his life in a country that was occupied by the Romans, a foreign military force. Today conflict still exists in that land and Bethlehem is surrounded by a high concrete wall with military checkpoints. There is no proper peace yet in Israel and all sides suffer because of that, but there are peaceful places there and time to think about what it all means.

St. George's Cathedral in Jerusalem is a haven of peace amid all the difficulties and conflict and it was a great privilege to worship there last week. Even so, we are glad to be home, back in Reedham and getting ready for Easter here in our churches. I am looking forward to Easter with hope that more and more people will understand why the Prince of Peace came into this world and what he died for.

REEDHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Meeting held on Monday 5th February 2018 at Reedham Village Hall

There were 8 Councillors present, the Clerk, District Councillor Grant Nurden and Chris Bradbury Chairman of the Village Hall. 5 members of the public were in attendance. Apologies were received from Councillors Case and Ball. The Council meeting commenced at 7.30 pm

Broadland District Council will be voting on the proposal to increase Council Tax by £5 per Band D house for 2018/19 later in the month. There is a recommendation for 2019/20 that most Council Tax bills will have no increase.

The Chairman of the Village Hall Committee Chris Bradbury provided the following report: there were no problems with the play equipment safety inspection in February. The tennis courts are out of action until they can be resurfaced. A large tree fell onto the tennis court fence causing extensive damage and the tractor shed roof lost quite a bit of felt in the strong winds. It is hoped the repairs will be covered by insurance. Two wooden sheds on the playing field were broken into, although it is not thought anything was stolen. The cash bingo jackpot was won in January so it now stands at £150 in 45 numbers or less. The 50/50 auction on 28th January 2018 raised £142. A quiz night is being held on 21st February starting at 7.30pm. The film Dunkirk will be shown on Wednesday 7th March at the new time of 7.30pm. Tickets will cost £4.50.

Cllr David Hale was elected as Vice Chairman of the Parish Council following the resignation from the post of Cllr Ian Case.

The Parish Council is considering undertaking a Neighbourhood Plan. If any parishioner is interested in joining a working party or would like further information please contact the Clerk.

A planning application was considered - proposed external alteration, enlarge garage and widen drive at The Pink House, 36 Riverside. The Council will object to the height of the proposed new garage as this obscures the neighbour's view. Notification was received that the application for office extension and boat house at Broadland Hoarding Solutions has been granted, with conditions.

There is still a vacant plot on the allotments. Anyone interested please contact the Clerk 01493 750254.

It is the duty of landowners to check the state of trees on their land. Various trees have been cleared from footpaths around the village.

There is a vacant position of Councillor on the Council. Further details can be obtained from the Clerk.

The Acle Safer Neighbourhood Action Panel will be holding a drop-in session on Friday 16th March from 5.30pm in Acle Library, Bridewell Lane, Acle.

A reminder that the Greater Norwich Local Plan consultation runs from 8th January to 15th March.

The Parish Council will be audio recording future meetings.

The Council agreed to hold an additional meeting to discuss the Permissive Path towards the end of February. Date, time and venue to be confirmed.
