Change is in the air. It is all about us. There is global change this week as Mr. Trump and Kim Jong Un have met and agreed on the beginning of a kind of peace process that can only be good. Let's hope that when you read this, the peaceful discussions are still in place.

Much closer to home there is welcome change too. The world has put on its colours and everywhere you go, whether in the cities or here in our villages, there are vibrant gardens like the Reedham garden in my photograph, and the fields and trees are amazingly green and growing. In the hedgerows the brilliant white blackthorn and cow parsley has given way to wild pink roses and white elderflower and the verges are dotted with poppies, pink campions and occasional splashes of white stitchwort. England in Spring and early Summer is a lovely place to be; as long as the weather remains clement.

I am writing this article in June and for some of our young people this is a time of great change in their lives as they have finished their GCSE exams and are beginning to consider seriously the direction they want to take in their working lives. Others will be leaving school and hoping to move into work and begin their careers. Still others will be taking A-Levels and hoping for success and to get the grades they need and, in the universities, young people, finishing their degree courses, will be taking their Finals and hoping to do well enough to move to their desired future. It is a stressful time of change for many of them and I know that everyone hopes for the best for all these young people.

There is change too in the Church as it moves forward in this 21<sup>st</sup> Century where so much political and social change is altering societies and cultures all over the world. Again, I believe it is change for the good. I have recently been reading two rather different books. One of them is about Pope Francis: 'Pope Francis, Untying the Knots', and the other is written by Archbishop Justin Welby: 'Re-imagining Britain – Foundations for Hope'. Both Pope Francis and Archbishop Justin talk about hopeful change for the future. Pope Francis says: 'What ordinary believers – and the world in general – need to hear from the Church above all today is a message of compassion'. 'The church', he says, 'is the house of the Father, where there is a place for everyone, with all their problems.' Archbishop Justin, in his book, writes of a church that needs to be engaged with society and has hope and confidence in the providence of God.

These two leaders of our Western Christian churches are hopeful about the church of the future and as long as the church gets its act together, and gets involved with today's diverse society, then I will be hopeful too.

## **Reedham Parish Council – Monday 4<sup>th</sup> June**

There were 5 Councillors present, the Clerk, District Councillor Grant Nurden and Chris Bradbury Chairman of the Village Hall. 2 members of the public were in attendance. Apologies were received from Councillors Hale, Lester, Ward, Grattan and Thompson, and County Councillor Brian Iles. The Council meeting commenced at 7.30 pm

District Councillor Nurden reported that the leader of Broadland District Council, Andrew Proctor, has been elected leader of Norfolk County Council so will be standing down from the Broadland role. A new leader will be elected in due course. The final report on the feasibility study for Broadland DC collaborating more closely with South Norfolk District Council is expected later this month with the decision being made by both Councils on the 12<sup>th</sup> July. Funding for 20 community planning groups has been secured for driving economic development, housing growth and joint commercial activities. The Chairman of the Village Hall Committee Chris Bradbury provided the following report: there were no problems with the play equipment safety inspection in June. The cash bingo jackpot was not won in May so it now stands at £190 in 49 numbers or less.

A planning applications for a front porch and single storey side extension and rear extension at Marsh View, 6 Witton Green, NR13 3HH received no objections.

There is still a vacant half plot on the allotments. Anyone interested please contact the Clerk 01493 750254.

There is also a vacant position of Councillor on the Council. Further details can be obtained from the Clerk.

Progress on reopening the Permissive Path was again discussed with an update being provided by Councillor Ward. Thanks were expressed for all the hard work he has put in to the project.

The Parish Council is still waiting for contact from Network Rail to arrange a site visit regarding the Station Bridge.

The Parish Council has a new website. It is currently under construction and further details will be published next month.

Two Councillors are to go on Neighbourhood Plan training. Anyone interested in more information or interested in joining a Neighbourhood Plan committee please contact the Clerk.

Problems with flooding at the 2<sup>nd</sup> Limpenhoe turning were discussed. The Clerk will be contacting Highways to see if there is a solution to the problem.

Grass cutting on the playing field and at the Church has been of very poor standard in recent months. The Parish Council has asked the contractor to revisit and make good where they have not cut properly or to the specifications. Payment has been withheld until the work is completed satisfactorily.

The Parish Council is funding, through money received from housing developments, refurbishment of the tennis courts. This will hopefully begin in July.
