A Rock and a Refuge

We were hit by a couple of storms in February. I once heard an ex-lighthouse-keeper talking about what it was like to be in the Fastnet light during a storm: huge Atlantic waves, actually breaking over the top of structure. The television picture disappeared, and you could feel the building bending with the impact - if it hadn't have done, it would have cracked and been dashed to pieces.

The psalmist often speaks of God as a rock, a refuge, a stronghold. The image is of a cave or fastness in the hills, to which the tribespeople could retreat when enemies threatened, difficult to reach and easy to defend. David and his followers made use of such when they were living as outlaws from the wrath of Saul.

For me that spiritual image turns inside out: I find God not so much as a wall around me, as an inner strength, one to be trusted, firm ground under our feet. We might think of Jesus, sleeping in the fishing boat through the storm on the lake, secure in his Father's love. In that case the rock is not just a refuge to retreat to (although God is there for us in times of distress) but also a platform from which to launch out into life and action; as one might imagine the Israelites launching counter-attacks from their mountain strongholds.

That's a pretty masculine image; and the description of God as a rock might seem hard, unfeeling – not like the God we know as Love. But, like the lighthouse, the strongest structures are not unyielding, but flexible, responsive – think how many trees survived our February gales. The love of God is also strong (as death, says the Song of Solomon). That love doesn't wrap us in cotton wool, but bids us take up our cross and follow Jesus.

Now snowdrops and aconites are over is a good time to split up clumps and spread them round the garden; it gives a better result than buying bulbs in the Autumn. There is a lot of moss growing this winter but it is easy to remove from paths while it is still wet by lifting with a spade. When it is drier a proprietary moss killer can be applied.

Seed potatoes can be chitted ready to plant out at Easter. Cabbage, cauliflower and lettuce can be sown in the greenhouse.

Plough Sunday at Wickhampton

It was a sunny but cold winter morning as we gathered for our United Benefice Plough Sunday worship on the church green at Wickhampton. Revd Martin Greenland blessed the tractor and plough driven by Alfie Dunthorne. Charles Reader presented the corn seed for blessing and all said "God speed the plough". This age-old tradition of Blessing the plough has become a firm favourite in St Andrews Church calendar.
