The Church has just celebrated Mary Magdalene (22nd July). The New Testament reading set for Morning Prayer was the passage from Luke's Gospel (8.1-3) in which he refers to Mary Magdalene among a number of female disciples, named and unnamed, who not only followed Jesus, but provided for the whole group out of their own means. It's characteristic of Luke that this is one of the few significant mentions of such women in the Gospels prior to the crucifixion, when Mary and others gain prominence as the first witnesses to the resurrection.

At the same time as making women visible, Luke also acknowledges that there were those who provided for Jesus during his itinerant ministry. We often see Jesus as an invited guest at formal dinners; but there's little mention of his day to day support and sustenance. It's Luke again who, later, tells us of the hospitality extended by Martha and Mary – but there Martha's provision is overshadowed by Mary's attentiveness to her master. Attention to Jesus' words and acts is the purpose of the gospel-writers; yet behind the scenes, Jesus' ministry must have depended on a degree of support and generosity from others: there were those who ministered to him.

Every year we welcome large numbers of holidaymakers to our area; at this time I always ask people to remember and pray for those who work to make those holidays possible, providing accommodation, food, attractions. There are extra demands on them this year because of the delayed start to the season and the new restrictions under which they have to work. There may also be more people wanting to come here, rather than going abroad.

On a wider scale, one of the positive things to come out of Coronavirus is the increased visibility of some of those people whose work supports our daily lives: shop workers, delivery drivers, care staff, etc. It's not been the same for everyone: while some people have had their degree of activity suppressed by the virus, through lockdown or furlough, others have had to work harder, under more demanding conditions. Hopefully that visibility and our increased appreciation will not disappear along with virus.

Elsewhere (Matthew 10.42) Jesus speaks appreciatively of anyone who offers so much as a cup of cold water to one of his disciples. Maybe he was also thinking of what he himself had received.

Church Services

Services are gradually resuming in church buildings, although the precise schedule for August is unlikely to be finalised in time for Outlook (Services at Freethorpe, Reedham and Wickhampton are being planned, plus 8am at Acle; Beighton remains closed). The weekly service on Zoom is currently continuing at 9.30am for the benefit of those not physically attending a service.

Note: Saturday Roman Catholic Mass is currently being held fortnightly at St. Edmund, Acle at 5pm.

Some general principles about attending Sunday services:-

The capacity of our churches is reduced by 2m social distancing: if you would like to attend a service you do not normally attend, please contact a churchwarden (or the Rector for 8am at Acle).

It's helpful to bring your own pocket hand sanitizer to Holy Communion, where communicants will receive the consecrated bread only.

Any service books or leaflets are either to be taken away or put to be quarantined at the end of the service.

Government guidance on social interaction should be observed before and after the service (currently 2 households inside; 6 persons outside).

Anyone with symptoms of Covid 19 or self-isolating should not attend. Those who are extremely vulnerable (shielding) are advised not to attend; other vulnerable people should consider the risk.

Reedham Gardening Club - August in the garden

Collect seeds, as they ripen, from aquilegia, sweet peas and nigella. Deadhead perennials to ensure continued blooms. Lift onions and shallots once their tops die down and leave to dry in the sun. You can still sow quick maturing salad crops such as summer lettuce, radish, rocket, sorrel, chicory and fennel.

REEDHAM PARISH COUNCIL 12.

Meeting held on Monday 6th July 2020 online via Zoom

There were 9 Councillors present, the Clerk, County Councillor Iles and District Councillor Grant Nurden. 4 members of the public were in attendance. The meeting commenced at 7.30pm

District Councillor Nurden reported that Broadland held an Extraordinary Council meeting on the 30th June to review the 2020/21 Budgets. The expected income was reduced and funding for Covid emergencies, Council Tax support and Hardship Payments were all increased. The estimated surplus of £62,000 was retained as a contingency.

The Chairman of the Village Hall Committee Chris Bradbury gave the following report: there were two issues with the play equipment safety inspection for July. The wooden swings in the small children's play area, the bolts that hold the metal bar which the swings hang off, require replacing at a cost of £13.00 from Amazon, and the end of the Zip Line, the spring buffer assembly has collapsed so the spring cannot absorb or cushion the impact of the Zip Line trolly. The Zip Line seat was fastened up so no one could use it, but this had been pulled down and used, the Zip Line seat has now been removed to prevent this happening again.

All the play equipment is still barriered off, due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak, the play equipment will remain closed for July and will be reviewed again end of this month.

People are still not complying with the 1mtr plus social distance rule on the playing field. Decorating in the village hall is now complete.

The village hall management all agreed not to open up the village hall.

We are still hosting online virtual Quiz Nights on Facebook and YouTube which seems very popular with people.

No planning applications were received.

A tree inspection was made at the Village Hall and several trees were identified as needing coppicing/pollarding/felling. This work will take place once the bird nesting season has finished.

The sensor was located on Halvergate Road next to Pettitts in June. Data was similar 13. to previous times, the 85% centile was 35.7mph, in a 30mph limit. Last April it was 35mph. However, the number of vehicles was significantly less, 5,500 compared to 8,000. In May the sensor was located on the Freethorpe Road. The 85% centile was 43.2mph, compared to 43mph last time. Similarly there were only 14,000 vehicle movements compared to 21,000.

There are currently no plots available at the allotments but if you would like to go on the waiting list please contact the Clerk or any member of the Allotment Association.

The Permissive Path Agreement has been signed by the Parish Council and the Landowner, and is now with the Broads Authority for them to sign and seal. A contractor to install the steps, boardwalk, kissing gates, bridge and fence was appointed by the Council. Work is expected to start before the end of August.

The Council is looking at ways to support local businesses to open safely now that Covid-19 restrictions are starting to ease. Please contact the Clerk or Councillor Rednall for further details.

A Social Media Policy was agreed at the meeting. The Financial Regulations, Review of Internal Control and Review of Audit were appraised and approved. All can be viewed on the Parish Council website.

The Wherryman's statue has been removed for renovation.
