

From the Rectory

It's easy to feel daunted and somewhat powerless in the face of something as great and intangible as climate change. And that threat can seem distant – we can always find more immediate things to distract us. Yet events like the recent severe flooding in the Low Countries should tell us what people elsewhere in the world have been shouting for some time: the threat isn't sometime in the future – it's already here. And because so many of the possible actions to counter it will take time to work through, we cannot afford to delay. The COP 26 summit in November will be critical – even more so for those who will inherit this world when we have left it.

Recognising that, the Young Christian Climate Network has initiated a relay pilgrimage, walking from St. Ives to Glasgow in daily stages: a demonstration of Christian concern and prayer; and a call to all of us, including participating politicians, to act.

It is suggested that tributary pilgrimages are organised to feed into the main route. One is being planned from Great Yarmouth to Kings Lynn – and Reedham is the first destination on Sat 21st August. We plan to welcome the pilgrims; and extend an invitation to anybody who wishes to join them on the Wherryman's Way for all or part of that day's walk (possibly get the train to Berney Arms) or the next. We'd also like to give them our written prayers and letters to the Prime Minister to carry to Kings Lynn, to be sent on from there. Look out for more detailed instructions on our website nearer the time.

A tributary is usually a river: that put me in mind of one of the latter visions of the prophet Ezekiel (Ch.47). An angel shows him a river flowing from under the threshold of a restored Jerusalem temple (a sign of a God-centred restoration after exile). He is then led to follow the river in stages of a thousand cubits: the water at first is ankle-deep, then knee-deep, then waist-deep and then too deep to wade through. He is then told of the life-giving properties of the river: flowing into the Dead Sea, it will turn its water fresh.

Our individual capacity to pray, or act, or urge others to act in the face of climate change may seem ineffective – a drop in the ocean. Yet any river is formed of countless individual drops: in the tributary they combine to form an unstoppable flow. As we saw in the Low Countries, for physical rivers swollen by excess rain, that flow can be tragically destructive. But the river of our prayer and action to counter climate change, like that of Ezekiel's vision, is life-giving. It's an encouragement to our politicians that we will support them in making brave but necessary decisions – as we have seen in the pandemic. And it's an encouragement to us all that each prayer we offer or action we take (e.g. driving less; eating less intensively-reared meat; avoiding plastic) is not irrelevant, but contributes to the flow.

REEDHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Meeting held on Monday 5th July 2021 online via Zoom

There were 9 Councillors present, the Clerk, District Councillor Grant Nurden and 3 members of the public. The meeting commenced at 7.30pm

District Councillor Grant informed the meeting that Broadland District Council's Place Shaping Policy Panel have recommended that the GNLP be sent to the Secretary of State for independent examination.

Chairman of the Village Hall Committee Chris Bradbury gave the following report:

There were no issues with the play equipment safety inspection for July.

Due to the government's 4 weeks extended lockdown, our first cash bingo on the 12th July, has been pushed back a week to the 19th July.

With the restrictions slowly lifting, we hope to start showing box office film again in August or September. We look forward to welcoming you back to cinema in Reedham Village Hall.

Reedham Stage School are performing Aladdin on Friday 23rd and Saturday 24th July at 7:30pm and Sunday 25th at 2:30pm

2 planning applications were considered:

20211189 - Proposed first floor extension, ground floor bay window extension, 3 bay cartshed and a hobbies workshop at 29 Station Road, NR13 3TB. The Council had no objections.

BA/2021/0238/HOUSEH - replacement quay heading and introduction of new quay heading to shorten length of existing cut at Brit House, 19 Station Road. The Council had no objections.

The speed sensor was located on Station Drive measuring vehicles driving away from the bridge. The 85% centile was 31.6mph in the 30mph limit; in September 2020 it was 30mph. 13,000 vehicles were recorded. 3% of speeders were travelling between 35 and 40mph, but only a few were travelling above 40mph. It is now located on New Road bend, facing The Hills.

A Book Exchange cupboard has been gifted to the Parish Council and will be installed once a suitable central location can be found.

The Neighbourhood Plan Committee will be sending out a questionnaire to all households. Please fill it in to let us know your views of the future shape of Reedham. The questionnaire can also be filled in online. See the Parish Council website for details.
