When Joseph brings his 130 year old father to Egypt, to seek refuge from the famine in Canaan, Jacob is granted a royal audience with the Pharaoh. On his entrance and at his departure, Genesis says that Jacob blessed Pharaoh. According to the Letter to the Hebrews, the lesser person is blessed by the greater; which is what we might expect; yet here the refugee Jacob blesses the king of Egypt – something of a paradox? It might be a peculiarity of the language; but it doesn't sound as though Jacob was humbling himself. Maybe it's a sign of the esteem in which Joseph was held. All we're told of the conversation is that Pharaoh asks him his age: perhaps it's that which generates the sense of mutual respect in the encounter. Long life was taken as a sign of God's favour: hence the age inflation in the sagas of Genesis.

We wouldn't make a direct connection today (otherwise what do you say of those who die young?) yet it's hard to be anything other than respectful towards long life or long service. We have a remarkable instance of both to celebrate in our Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Certain aspects of the monarchy in this country are somewhat paradoxical; and the Queen often has to embody apparent opposites. There will be pageantry and formality to mark the occasion: the monarchy needs to speak to us of continuity, hence the high degree of tradition; yet a tradition that continually has to be examined and reinterpreted, lest the institution appear outdated. The popular celebrations around the extended holiday – the street parties, fetes and community gatherings – will highlight that part of the genius of the Queen is that she belongs to us all. Yet not in such a way that we feel we can dictate what she does or is: she is above all that. The Prime Minister equally belongs to us all; but the political dimension means that the PM will always attract controversy. The Queen, although head of state, exercises no political power at all. Although in theory nobody dictates what she does, in practice her role demands a lot of her; and she is rarely free to reveal her own thoughts or display her real feelings. There must be a fair degree of tedium about some of the things she is called on to do; yet she discharges her duties with grace. Despite the trappings of wealth and privilege, an important aspect of her role is to bring recognition and honour to the things and people of ordinary life – bestowing a kind of blessing.

And we have been richly blessed these last 70 years through her sense of duty and service; by her wisdom, grace and sense of humour. And so we rightly rejoice, and pray for God's continued blessing on her – especially as she copes with the frustrations and restrictions of advanced age (although maybe there are some compensations: I'm sure she prefers the Royal Windsor Horse Show to the State Opening of Parliament!). In this part of her reign, as much as at its beginning, we know she will be seeking the guidance and strength of God.



Jobs in the garden

With the extra warmth and light this month, keep on top of weeds

by hoeing regularly. Plant out summer bedding, give containers and baskets a liquid feed every few weeks to encourage flowering.

Feed lawns with a liquid or granular fertiliser.

Harvest radish, lettuce, other salads and early potatoes.

Cut down chives to the base for a fresh crop of new leaves in just a few weeks.

Cover ripening fruits with netting to protect from birds.

An update was given on the opening hours of the Doctor's surgery:

Cllr Tom Rednall resigned from the Council due to work commitments. He thanked the Council for making him feel welcome and accepted. Cllr Hale thanked him for taking the opportunity to join the Council, and wished him the best for the future.

Chairman of the Village Hall Committee Chris Bradbury gave the following report: There were no issues with the play equipment safety inspections for April. However children are finding it difficult to climb onto the zipwire from the platform base. Fenland Leisure have been contacted for improvements. They have also been asked to quote for replacing the swing seats in the small play area and for an independent inspection of all the play equipment.

An oak tree has been planted on the playing field to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. In June a brass plaque will be formally placed to commemorate her remarkable achievement.

The March Cash Bingo jackpot wasn't won, the jackpot stands for April at £270 in 52 numbers or less. This month's Cash Bingo is on the 25th at 7.30pm.

At our Easter Egg hunt yesterday we had an overwhelming number of entries, but it was enjoyed by all.

I planning application was considered:

a) 20220227 – change of use of the land from paddock to include a maneage and erection of stable and provision of standing pad at Low Farm Cottage, Low Farm Road, NR13 3HE. The Council resolved **no objections**.

I notification of approval was received:

 a) BA/2022/0048/FUL – retrospective change of use to domestic curtilage and erection of a close boarded timber 6ft boundary fence at Nelsons Cottage, 38B Riverside. NR I 3 3TE.

Cllr David Hale was elected Chairman, and Cllr Liz Bassett was elected Vice-Chairman.

Chairman of the Village Hall Committee Chris Bradbury gave the following report: There were no issues with the play equipment safety inspections for May.

Two loads of ash have been donated and transported for free by the Cantley Factory for the car park and driveway.

A Highways road surfacing lorry has been parked outside the hall for over a week. We had no notification it would be parked there.

The April Cash Bingo jackpot wasn't won. The jackpot for May stands at £280 in 53 numbers or less.

The June film, on the 17th, will be Death on the Nile.

The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebration on the 2nd June will be an outdoor celebration with the lighting of a beacon at 9:45pm. There will be music, a Punch and Judy, and Magic show.
