According to a recent letter, a well-loved Acle institution will close at the end of March ... to reopen, under new management, in May. That is welcome news, for Wilkerson Hardware is a valuable local facility, not just for what it sells, but for what it is. Of course, it remains to be seen what changes will take place during April: will cherished aspects of the business disappear? Will we still be able to buy a single bolt or screw? Will the friendly and knowledgeable customer service persist? Hopefully; but let's also hope that the relaunch will make it fit it to endure as a local business long into the future.

The process of renewal, or the arrival of something completely new, often has an intrinsic element of death and loss. Swallowtail Place was built on the site of AgeUK's much loved respite and day care centre, Herondale. There isn't a direct connection in this case, although it was an aspiration that the location should continue to contribute to support and care for those who need it within the community.

Sometimes the link with loss is more direct and personal. An untimely or tragic death sometimes spurs a bereaved family or community to establish a campaign or charitable trust in memory of the deceased: to redeem their loss by some positive and hopeful initiative. Although in theory this might have happened earlier, or in different circumstances, in practice the death provides the impetus. I write as news has broken of the suspicious death in custody of Russia's opposition leader Alexei Navalny. Will his blood, like that of Cain's brother Abel, cry out from the ground, to reenergise those who look for positive change in the Russian regime?

Also at the end of March this year fall Good Friday and Easter Day. The gospels agree that Jesus died at Passover time, an attempt by the religious leadership to rid themselves of one they saw as a troublesome opponent. The lambs then sacrificed at Passover marked God's redemption of his people from slavery in Egypt. For Christians, Jesus is our Passover, sacrificed for us (I Corinthians 5.7); the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Unlike the other lambs, Jesus doesn't remain dead. His spilt blood doesn't just cry out from the ground: it energises the life of a renewed community of faith, who share his resurrected life.

Congratulations were given to Chris Bradbury, Chairman of the Community Association, on receiving a British Empire Medal in the New Year's honours. He was thanked for all he does for the village.

There were no planning applications received for consideration.

In December the speed sensor was on Riverside looking towards the Lord Nelson. The 85th percentile was 18.6mph. This is perhaps not the best location for it on Riverside as traffic naturally slows there but there are no other suitable posts. The average number of cars was 297 per day. It is now located at the school.

The Council has confirmed that it owns the land of the Woodland Walk. It was purchased in 1981 but ownership was not documented properly at the time with Land Registry. There will be a cost for doing this now but the Council want their ownership of the land properly registered.

The Council were successful in their application for funding for a new planter for flowers outside the toilets.

The budget and precept for 2024/25 was approved. It will be £23,392.

Local Access to Libraries

Did you know that you can access Acle Library between 8am and 7pm Monday to Friday, between 8am and 4pm on Saturdays and between 10am and 4pm on Sundays even when the Library is not staffed? The Library is staffed between 10am & 7pm on Tuesdays and Thursdays, between 2pm & 7pm on Fridays and between 1pm & 4pm on Saturdays. 
