Season of Creation

In 1989, Ecumenical Patriarch Dimitrios I proclaimed Ist September as a day of prayer for creation for Orthodox Christians. The World Council of Churches took up the idea, extending it into a season (sometimes known as *Creationtide*) culminating on 4th October, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi; and invited churches to participate. This year's theme for what is now promoted as the Season of Creation is To hope and act with Creation. The organisers (drawn from various Christian organisations and including our own Bishop Graham) say that the capital C is significant: one emphasis is that Creation is not an object that has been created for human use, but rather a subject that we are called to relate to and collaborate with as fellow creatures.

Language can be revealing about how we regard and treat an entity. To use the word *Creation* implies that all that is has a source in God. The Orthodox church year begins on Ist September with a commemoration of God's creation of the world. The fundamental stories, of course, are found at the beginning of the Bible, in Genesis. It's possible to connect aspects of those stores with ways that we still speak of and relate to the living (and non-living) world.

The 6-day creation story culminates in the creation of human beings in God's own image, giving the possible impression that all that has gone before is a kind of stage for human life. In our own time we sometimes speak of the *environment*: it's there in the title of the responsible government department, DEFRA. Human society is what matters: creation is just what surrounds us. In an age when roughly 80% live in urban areas, that perspective may be hard to shift. For most people, the *countryside* is outside: perhaps a place for leisure, valued for landscape or the potential for recreational activities.

That recreation might include engaging with *nature*. The way we use the word often implies something other than human. In Genesis the non-human is created separately and before the arrival of human beings. Yet how much of what we see around us in England's green and pleasant land is truly natural? A field is a unit of production; a hedgerow is an artificial boundary marker or livestock barrier. To a trained eye, a wood shows signs of human exploitation and management across centuries — unless it's a plantation, in which case it's a field of trees. Upland landscapes are shaped by excessive sheep grazing, or drainage, or management for grouse. Human impacts are seen almost everywhere on earth; reflecting the divine command in Genesis to *have dominion over* other living things. Yet, equally, there are *natural processes*, some of which readily take over if human influence reduces. That can suggest the two are in tension, opposed; as implied by words like *wilderness* and *wasteland*. Paradoxically, *nature conservation* is often concerned with attempting to arrest natural processes — but that's a whole debate in itself!

Having dominion over something doesn't necessarily involve exploiting it, but creation is widely seen as a *natural resource*; often (mistakenly) considered free of charge and limitless. On the basis of *if you can't beat them, join them*, there have been recent moves to put a price on the economic benefits to human beings of natural processes – so called *eco-system services*, like carbon capture, water filtration and flood control.

But are we only to value the rest of creation by what we get out of it? One could argue that Genesis says no. God spends five and a half days on the rest of the cosmos: human beings don't even get a day to themselves. Countering our superiority is the message that we are, as the Season of Creation says, *fellow-creatures*; in the second Genesis narrative, moulded from something as lowly as the dust of the ground. A bit more humility in the face of Creation (with a capital C) would serve us well.

The current village hall at Cantley is fast approaching its 100^{th} anniversary and requires replacement as it is becoming costly to maintain and to conform to current standards. As a result, the Trustees have embarked on an ambitious project to build a new hall with an overall budget of £1.1m. The new hall will provide a community

hub for Cantley and the surrounding area for the next 100 years with an exciting footprint including a

badminton court (or four table tennis tables) as well as two clinical rooms available to GPs and community nursing teams. The planning application will be submitted in September and construction planned to commence early in 2025 subject to raising the funds required for the construction phase of the project. 
