

*"But God sent me ahead of you ...to save your lives by a great deliverance."
(Genesis 45.7)*

When I was a curate in Shrewsbury, a lovely lady from the congregation made me a beautiful red stole for Pentecost. I was really touched, especially when she drew my attention to two little words she had embroidered on the inside. "I remember you saying", she said, "that these were your two most favourite words in the whole Bible." Those two little words are "BUT GOD..."

As we approach the end of Joseph's story in Genesis, you could sum it all up in those words: "BUT GOD..."

Joseph was spoilt, arrogant, immature and insensitive – but God knew there were qualities in him that he could use. Joseph was betrayed and abused – but God used that situation to get him to the place where he was needed. Joseph was the victim of false accusations; he was used for what people could get out of him and then forgotten – but God sustained him, kept him going, until the time was right for him to use the gift he'd been given. But God.

Remarkably, when Joseph does his great reveal and has his "Surprise!! It's me!"-moment with his brothers he is able to see his life through this 'but God' lens. "Don't be distressed or angry with yourselves for selling me here. This famine is going to be long and severe. But God sent me ahead of you to preserve and save you."

The things that had happened to Joseph could have caused him to doubt God's goodness or led to passivity and defeatism. But, rather than resignation, Joseph embraces a vocation. Through it all Joseph had a vision that there was something better in store, beyond his current situation, something worth hanging on in for. Now, he will provide for his family, indeed for many, and comfort them and speak prophetically to them about God's future deliverance.

This raises all sorts of questions for me, mostly of the variety: does God allow or cause bad things to happen in order to bring about some higher purpose? I'm not sure I know how to make sense of that.

I do know that only Joseph, as the one who has suffered and been wronged, has the right to make this connection between his own suffering and God's purposes. It's not for others to make that link for him. And that prompts me to ask myself: so, what about me? Am I able to look at my life's ups and downs (particularly the downs) as part of God's purposes; as something that he can use? And what difference might it make to me and others if I can? What "But God" is in store for me and for those that God might lead me to?

And what vision will keep me going? Perhaps, ultimately, the story of that other Son of Israel; summed up in Peter's words at Pentecost "Jesus of Nazareth... ..handed over to you by God's deliberate plan and foreknowledge; and you, with the help of wicked men, put him to death by nailing him to the cross. BUT GOD raised him from the dead, freeing him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on him." (Acts 2.22-24) "BUT GOD..." They may be just two little words, but they are gamechangers.
