"Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to men by which we must be saved." When Peter said those words about Jesus to the council of religious leaders in Jerusalem, he was sticking his neck out. More than that, he was risking his life.


A few years back, in 2011, I was preaching on these verses from Acts 4, which comes up this Sunday in the lectionary. Back then I noted how we don't really face the same kind of risk that Peter did, or that Christians in some other countries might face, when we speak out as followers of Jesus. We might face a bit of incredulity, ridicule or apathy, but nothing worse. I find myself now, just 10 years later, sadly wondering if that is still the case, or whether these days we do risk more than just a bit of eye-rolling or teasing if we make such exclusive claims about Jesus Christ.

How was Peter able to be so bold?

We read that he is filled with the Holy Spirit. Just when he needed to take a deep breath and answer the interrogation of the authorities, God stepped in. God inspired the words that Peter would utter. God gave him the courage to say them. We can pray for the same Spirit.

Later in the chapter Peter concludes by saying "We cannot help speaking about what we have seen and heard." Peter is simply sharing his own story. He cannot deny his own lived experience of knowing Jesus and seeing him at work in the lives of all those who encountered him. We can pray that we would have our own experience of Jesus at work in our lives and have our own stories to share.

One of the things Peter had experienced was hearing, first-hand, Jesus explaining, 'I am the good shepherd and I lay down my life for the sheep. The reason my Father loves me is that I lay down my life — only to take it up again.' Why is Peter so convinced that salvation is found in no one else? Because no one else had died for him. No one else had conquered death for him. None of the other gods or prophets or philosophers on offer had done that. Not then. Not now.
