

COVID 19 STFP FOUR UPDATE

If you have any questions, queries or concerns, please contact the Vicar or Churchwardens.

Face coverings are no longer mandatory but are encouraged, especially when moving around the building.

Social distancing Distancing is no longer mandated. Therefore, there is no general numerical restriction on attendance at any service, including baptisms, weddings, and funerals.

Everyone attending church is encouraged to use the whole building and to respect the space of others.

The central pews in the nave will return to full use. The side aisles will remain distanced for those who wish to remain distanced.

Hymns will now be sung on Sundays at 10.30am. You are encouraged to ensure that you are well spaced around the church. You may choose to wear a face covering when singing.

It is expected that the choir will return in September for practice, and October for services.

Please continue to leave your **collection** on the plate at the back of church.

It will be presented at the offertory.

The peace may be shared physically amongst those who wish but please share only with those in your pew. If you do not wish to share the peace physically, please wave the peace instead to indicate this!

Holy Communion continues to be received standing and using the one-way system still in place in church. You are encouraged to sanitise your hands before receiving.

Church of England guidance now permits receiving Holy Communion in both kinds (i.e. bread and wine) The chalice will be available for those who wish to receive it. No intinction (dipping wafers).

After Buddy's sponsored walkies and the Midnight Wander, we'll be looking for the next challenge!



Mission for MIND accomplished!!

A dedicated group of dogs and humans from St George's Church, Stalybridge accepted the challenge made by Buddy, the Vicar's dog, to walk as far as possible during the fifty days of Eastertide as part of Buddy and buddies' Sponsored Walkies. Some pledged to walk 200 miles, some pledged to walk 10 miles, some did it as a joint event with a family member, and some said they would simply do the best they could. In all weathers, they managed to walk a staggering 2500 miles between them and were each sponsored by family, friends, and church members. The final total raised was a wonderful £2,500. Funds raised are being split between Tameside, Oldham and Glossop Mind, and St George's Church.



On Tuesday 20th July, Jason from TOG Mind gave a talk to members of St George's on the work of Mind, supporting and promoting good mental health in the community, and a presentation of £1,250 was made. This was generously topped up by a generous attendee to make the total for TOG Mind £1,300!

Jason from TOG Mind said "We are so grateful to the members of St George's Church for their fantastic effort and support. We couldn't do all we do without wonderful local residents fundraising and volunteering with us. It's hugely appreciated".

St George's Church received £1,250 from Buddy and buddies' sponsored walkies.

This is to be spent for our ministry and mission on the church and in the community.

The PCC have so far allocated:

£300 to Junior Church, particularly in developing work with high school aged young people

£300 to developing a Place of Welcome to show hospitality, friendship and support to all in our community.

The remainder of the money will be allocated as needs are identified.
