



Near Stalybridge Fire Station, Rassbottom Street





# Paws for thought

## Why do dogs have eyebrows?

This is not a joke - it's a serious question with a fascinating answer!



I have wondered about it since I have noticed that you human beings are communicating with one another differently since you have had to wear masks. There is much more eyebrow action going on - you are smiling (and frowning) more with your eyes as people are unable to see your mouths! You are doing really well at it too!

Junior Church will remain on Zoom for the remainder of this school year (the last online session will be Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> July) and will hopefully return in person in September!


