Hello,

My name is Brenda Greetham and I'd like to introduce myself to those who don't yet know me as the new warden at Norwood Chapel Day Retreat and Conference Centre. I'm saying 'new' whilst realising that I have actually been here for almost 3 months now!

What can I tell you about myself? Originally from Bradford, I moved into the Wharfe Valley 35 years ago on starting my training as a Mental Health Nurse in Burley-in-Wharfedale. I remained in the area (mainly Otley) until moving to Farnley 2½ years ago and then coming to live in the beautiful Washburn Valley at the beginning of February.

Although I am no longer married, I am the mother of 4 children, their ages ranging from 30 (a son, Peter, living in London) to my youngest Evie who is 15, with Olivia and Alexander in between! Evie lives here at Chapel House with me but is often to be found at nearby stables, being mad about horses.

Prior to applying for the warden position I found myself at a crossroads in my working life, having been a nurse

in the NHS for many years but gradually becoming disillusioned with the job. I had also harboured a desire for some years to work within a Christian setting and as I sought God's guidance I was led to apply for the warden position - and here I am! Throughout my life I have always enjoyed being in a caring role and therefore am looking towards recruiting a team of volunteers who might enjoy spending some time in the garden, helping me. Please do get in touch if this appeals to you (I promise you that tea and cakes will be in plentiful supply!).

The Centre is used regularly throughout the year (with the exception of the winter months) by groups mainly from churches, many of who have been coming here year upon year.

There is however potential to develop the use of the Centre further and various ideas are currently being explored, including making it more available to the general public and to the local community. Many of us, I'm sure, have felt the unexpected pleasure of trying a church door and finding

that it opens. There is an ever-increasing number of walkers, cyclists and cars passing by as the weather gets warmer and it would be good to be able to offer them a stopping place where they can rest and 'refuel'.

We are keen to gather the views of the local community about how we could use the Centre for their benefit and I am in the process of organising a day over the next 2 months where local people can come and share some ideas or just come and enjoy some refreshments (watch out for a notice in next month's magazine).

We hope in particular that the Centre will increase its use as a venue for individual retreats. It has much to offer those who need to escape from the stresses and strains of life, and to

those who find themselves in difficult and challenging circumstances as a place of peace, refreshment and hope.

I would like, in closing, to extend my gratitude for the fantastic welcome I have received from people who had previously been strangers and for the many offers of help, advice and support both from our chapel congregation and from the wider church within the valley.



Note from Editor,



GOOD NEWS

“St Andrew’s Church, Blubberhouses has successfully secured a grant of £14800 from the Government’s Listed Places of Worship Roof Repair Fund to address urgent roof repairs that will ensure it is weathertight, safe and open for use. It is one of 502 grants from a total funding package of £30million that have been announced for



urgent roof repairs for places of worship across the UK by the Chancellor of the Exchequer. The Fund is administered by the National Heritage Memorial Fund (NHMF) on behalf of the Department for Culture Media and Sport (DCMS). More details are available at www.lpowroof.org.uk.”



A group from the united churches in the Washburn valley, and beyond, walked from Stack Point car park, along the reservoir side and up the path to the Church on Palm Sunday. The day was cool and damp, but that did not deter us – least of all the donkeys loaned and led by the Barker family. The donkeys enjoyed

their second visit to the church in four months and behaved themselves impeccably. The walk was followed by a short service for Palm Sunday.

NOW!! IN MAY

Adi and Loko know what it's like to live life on the edge. Living in Ethiopia, just 25 miles away from each other, they have never met. And yet their stories are cut from the same cloth - girls born into traditional rural communities that value boys; struggling to provide for large families; strong women. "Hunger is difficult, hunger makes you blind. If you are hungry you can't see. Your legs can't walk and your mind can't think." Adi knows. Left with no cattle and just one sheep when her husband died, she and her eight children ate just once a day - and very little even then. No husband, no livestock, no status. Then Christian Aid provided her with a cow. All change! From a single cow Adi got milk, churned butter, made a little money - and found hope.

For now, gathering and selling wood from miles away in the dangerous bush - four times a week - is the only way Loko can afford to give her children even one small meal of

boiled maize each day. She too knows hunger at first hand. "With a cow, I could sell the milk and butter and save up to start a small business... When the children have milk to drink, they are healthy." Loko has a young teenage step-daughter, Dabo. Dabo dreams of becoming a teacher. Despite their poverty, Loko is determined that Dabo should stay at school. What sacrifice!

The cost of a cow? £150. This Christian Aid Week, can we raise enough money to give Loko and a dozen or more women like her a life-changing cow? It's a practical and very possible aim.

Christian Aid Week is 10-16 May this year. If you would be willing to help with our house-to-house collection - and have not done so before - please give me a ring on (01943) 851234.

Our aim is that the service should reflect the life, ministry and mission of the Episcopal Area. Attached is a poster/flyer for the service, please could you distribute it as widely as possible round your Deanery and encourage folk to both suggest contributions and book the date in their diaries.



We welcomed Ros Lilley, a volunteer with the Yorkshire Wildlife Trust, to our April meeting. The Trust was set up over 65 years ago after Sir Frances Terry and Arnold Rowntree, of the York chocolate dynasties, successfully purchased Askham Bog near York when it was threatened by development. Initially the Yorkshire Naturalists' Trust it eventually became the Yorkshire Wildlife Trust a few years later and gained charitable status. By 1966 membership had reached 1000 and by 1998 the Trust had formed 25 nature reserves across Yorkshire. There are now 95 reserves stretching from Spurn Point in the east to Ingleborough in the west and, with a current membership of 36,000 and rising, it continues to flourish. The Trust's aims are to protect, conserve and record wildlife in Yorkshire and along with a staff of 90 plus, they have an army of volunteers who help out in all sorts of ways. Ros was a most interesting speaker and whilst many of us had heard of the Trust we didn't exactly know what they did but Ros's illustrated talk was both enlightening and informative and it was a thoroughly enjoyable evening.

Later this month our newly formed walking group will meet and in early May another new group for crafty crafters will meet too. May also sees some of us take part in a section of the Ripon Rowel centenary walk which will be walked in stages over several days, and we'll also be visiting Kiplin Hall near Richmond for '100 Shades of Green', our Federation craft exhibition which has attracted entries from all over the North Yorkshire West region and should be a spectacular event. We'll be following that with a visit to Thorp Perrow Arboretum on the way back.

We're very much looking forward to our May 14th meeting as our speaker is Maria Glot who's an expert on the life of Sir Titus Salt and the history of Saltaire village, the World Heritage Site. Maria is a highly amusing and entertaining speaker so it should be a great night.




