

Dear Friends,

Autumn is almost upon us; there's a slight chill in the air and the leaves are just beginning to change colour on the trees. As we look forward to this new season we look forward to the abundance of harvest festivals when we celebrate God's generous provision of food, of grain, fruit, vegetables, fish and meat.

For some autumn is a favourite time of the year with its riot of colours; whether that be the fruit and veg I've already mentioned adorning our Harvest Festival displays or the wonderful variety of colours of leaves on the trees and carpeting the ground. Sunsets at this time of the year can be particularly vivid and there have been some wonderful reds and oranges in the evening skies.

For others autumn is less welcome. It is the time when the weather gets cooler and sunlit afternoons in the garden with a cool drink become memories, it is a time of bare trees and empty fields; it is a time of change.

Change! It is a word we don't often like in churches. We like our traditions, our ways of doing things because we see them as the right way to 'do church' and they can bring us comfort. One probably apocryphal elderly Church Steward is reported to have said, "I've seen lots of changes in this church over the years and I've resisted every single one of them."

The thing is, life is about change and if we don't change then we will wither and die. If we want to live and grow as individuals and churches then we need to embrace change; the change that God, by his Holy Spirit, is constantly leading us towards. We don't need to totally abandon the past, although personally I would like to see sixteenth century English completely banished from Christian worship: but we can respect the past and all that has gone before whilst also embracing the future.

If trees did not shed their leaves, if plants didn't enter a cycle of dormancy, if they just stayed the same in autumn then we wouldn't have the abundance of spring and summer the following year.

Similarly if we don't embrace the change we need in our churches, if we are not willing to grow and change as disciples of Jesus Christ, then our churches will become static and die, because there is no life without growth. Together, as Christians in the valley, we can embrace change and grow together as disciples of Jesus Christ; we can see our churches grow and flourish with new life and hope. If we are willing, all this is possible by the grace and power of God.

The Parish Council accounts for the last financial year are available to view on the parish website www.washburnpc.co.uk. If anyone needs to report an incidence of fly tipping go on the Harrogate Borough Council website www.harrogate.gov.uk then search fly tipping. It leads you to a form to fill in the details and then you pinpoint the exact location on a map of where the dumping occurred. If any resident has concerns about a hazardous road or the safety of pedestrians on a road, it can be reported on the North Yorkshire website www.northyorks.gov.uk search for 95 Alive. Under the adult section there is a form to report hazardous road conditions. A recent email, from the police, contained last month's crime figures. There has been a spate of quad bike thefts and break-ins particularly in Timble and Fewston, so please take care locking up your property.

WE met on 10 September for a very interesting and professional film show of our beautiful countryside. Gordon & Anne Sharp who are known as Spellbound Productions gave us two lovely films, the first being the West Riding of Yorkshire which followed the old geographical boundaries of the West Riding with a superb blend of heritage, history and natural phenomena, amazing waterfalls, pretty villages and a hint of the industrial prowess of this fine County. It featured Ripon, Fountains Abbey, Pateley Bridge, Saltaire, Ilkley, Addingham, Burnsall, Linton, Grassington, Kilnsey plus the Show and all its great events, Kettlewell, Buckden and many more including the Wakeman from Ripon, George Pickles (now retired). George was appointed in the ancient ceremony of 'setting the watch' from 2004 to his retirement in 2015. Added to the beautiful villages and events we saw in this film was also fauna, bees, floral displays and lots of love close-ups of birds, many of which Gordon had to get up very early in the morning to film.

The next film featured the Lake District, which again and in contrast to the Dales, with the high mountains, Lake Windermere, Buttermere, the poet John Ruskin's lovely house, with glorious views of the mountains and the autumn colours set against a background of mountains, the Lakes in the winter looked particularly stunning, and couldn't of course miss mentioning the influence of Wainwright and his long walking history throughout the Lake

District. Their films are also enhanced by the beautiful music Gordon has put in the background.

Anne & Gordon travel quite extensively, they live in Bolton by Bowland, near Clitheroe and have presented their films to many WI's and different organisations. They have numerous films to present on various parts of the country and also abroad, including Austria, Bavaria and even Peru.

We all had a super evening, the WI is celebrating its 100 years this year which we toasted with a very welcoming special supper and we also toasted our Queen who has been the longest serving Queen since Queen Victoria.

An Ordinary meeting of MWPC was held at Askwith Village Hall on 27 August 2015. The parishes of Nesfield with Langbar, Denton, Askwith and Weston were all represented along with Harrogate County Councillor John Fort. New Councillor for Nesfield/Langbar Kathryn Chivers was welcomed to the council. Items carried over from the last meeting included:

Askwith School and Highways: A speed survey had been undertaken by 95 Alive and average speeds were less than 25mph, these are within the required limit, so no further action will be taken.

Denton traffic issues: It was confirmed that the white lines around the triangle had now been repainted. It was confirmed that the seat in Askwith had been painted and Cllr Pettie had applied for a Cold Calling Zone to be set up in Askwith. Under discussion and highway matters, the damaged barriers on the Denton road adjacent to the river were to be reported to Highways along with Japanese Knott weed growing in the verge at Denton and the poor condition of Moorside Lane Askwith. The annual insurance was to be renewed with Zurich; accounts were presented, planning issues discussed. The new transparency code had been added to the web site, which had now received 289 hits.

The next meeting is 19th November 2015 at Askwith Village Hall starting at 7.45pm.





