Take time to work – it is the price of success.

Take time to do charity – it is the key to Heaven.

Looking at the list I know that I do all those things – but do I do them often enough? I want to do more, but that means something else will have to stop; some things need prioritising, but that can be difficult. Meanwhile the Great Tit is taking time to eat the nuts, the Robin is enjoying the mealworms and the Goldfinch is on the niger seed.

I pray that you will be able to make the most of your time with family, work and friends, and also make time for yourself.

We met on Thursday 8 October when our speaker was Claudia Rickard. a Clinical Hypnotherapist, who uses hypnotherapy to assist people of all ages with any difficulties or problems they may need guidance with. The WI were given a sample of her work. Claudia helped us to relax and talked us through the stages of relaxing and going into a deep sleep whilst still feeling aware of our surroundings and colleagues.

It was an interesting experiment and many of the members felt drowsy and peaceful during the process, Claudia was in complete control of our relaxed state of mind, eventually and slowly we were woken up, and we continued with our talk and interest in her work.


