

Our theme, “Crossing the Washburn Waters, from hiping stones to bridges” continues and the extended programme of events is below.

We hope you'll enjoy some events and drop in to see the exhibition. As we keep reminding our visitors – we are not just a tea-room! Why not join as a member for only £10 per year – the fantastic 20% discount on events means that you could save the membership fee on just one event!

Friday 12th January is another of our ever popular suppers “**A brow nicht with well tidy scran**” Starting at 7.00pm until 10.00pm, come and enjoy a robust Scottish flavoured supper, halfway between Hogmanay and Burns Night: four typical Scottish courses, some entertaining readings and cash bar. As a curtain raiser to our next theme “Halls and Houses of the Valley”, Janet Niepokojczycka returns on **Wednesday 17th January** from 2.30pm until 4.00pm to present “**Gateways to the Past**”. Janet will present views of some historic gatehouses in the North of England including a close study of the 14th century gatehouse in Cartmel, once the gated entrance to Cartmel Priory, then a courthouse, school and heritage centre. It's now owned by the National Trust. Cost is £7.50 (members £6.00)

All in the month of January

It was:

400 years ago, on 4th Jan 1618 that Francis Bacon became Lord Chancellor of England.

175 years ago, on 2nd Jan 1843 that Wagner's opera 'The Flying Dutchman' was first performed, in Germany.

150 years ago, on 8th Jan 1868 that Sir Frank Dyson, British Astronomer Royal (1910-33), was born. His observations during the 1919 solar eclipse helped support Einstein's theory of general relativity. He also introduced the Greenwich time signal 'pips'.

125 years ago, on 14th - 16th Jan 1893 that the Independent Labour Party was founded in the UK. It was led by Keir Hardie and was a precursor to the Labour Party (founded 1900).

100 years ago, from Jan 1918 to Dec 1920 that the 1918 'flu pandemic took place. About 500 million people were infected and 50 - 100 million people died (5% of the global population).

90 years ago, on 2nd Jan 1928 that the BBC radio broadcast its first Daily Service - a 15 minute daily religious service. It is still running today.

Also 90 years ago, on 11th Jan 1928 that Thomas Hardy, British novelist and poet died. (Wrote Far from the Madding Crowd, the Mayor of Casterbridge, Tess of the d'Urbervilles, Jude the Obscure, etc)

75 years ago, from 24th to 31st Jan 1943 that the battle of Stalingrad took place. Adolf Hitler ordered the German 6th army to keep fighting to the death, even though they had no chance. 'But German Field Marshal Friedrich Paulus finally surrendered.

65 years ago, on 31st Jan to 1st Feb that the North Sea flood of 1953 took place. North-western Europe was hit by extensive flooding when severe gales combined with a Spring tide. Several thousand people were killed.

60 years ago, on 1st Jan 1958 that the European

Economic Community (EEC) began operating. It was incorporated into the European Union (EU) in 1993 as the European Community (EC).

Also 60 years ago, on 1st Jan 1958 that Chinese leader Mao Zedong announced the Great Leap Forward. It was a five-year plan to transform China from an agrarian economy into a socialism society via rapid industrialisation and collective farming. Tens of millions died.

50 years ago, on 2nd Jan 1968 that South African cardiac surgeon Christiaan Barnard performed the world's second human heart transplant. The patient lived for 19 months.

30 years ago, on 3rd Jan 1988 that Margaret Thatcher became Britain's longest-serving Prime Minister of the 20th century.

25 years ago, on 1st Jan 1993 that the European Single Market was established.

20 years ago, on 17th Jan 1998 that news of the Monica Lewinsky scandal became public. US President Bill Clinton was accused of having an affair with former White House intern Monica Lewinsky.

Also 20 years ago, in Jan 1998, that the film Titanic was released in the UK.

10 years ago, on 11th Jan 2008 that Sir Edmund Hillary, New Zealand mountaineer and Antarctic explorer, died. He and Sherpa mountaineer Tenzing Norgay were the first two people to conquer Mount Everest.

Also 10 years ago, on 26th Jan 2008 that Paul the Octopus was born. This British-born German octopus was said to accurately predict football results in the 2010 World Cup. (Died 2010, aged two and a half.)

The Annual governance statement was then approved by the council. Accounts for the period February to May were presented and planning issues discussed. The web site had now had 2602 visits an increase of 28%


WASHBURN PARISH COUNCIL LAUNCHES NEW WEBSITE
