
Teddy Church

Are you going abroad on holiday?

Be careful which medicines you pack – what is legal in this country may NOT be legal in the country to which you are going. And, as figures from the Health Survey for England show that 48 per cent of us are taking prescription medication, this will affect very many of us.

Officials at the Foreign Office strongly advise you to check the rules online before you travel. For example, even Vicks and Sudafed are illegal in some countries. In others, such as Greece, Diazepam, Tramadol, and codeine are controlled drugs. Sleeping pills, anti-anxiety pills and strong painkillers require a license in Singapore.

So – do read the travel advice for each country before you go.

His Honour Harry Walker - an appreciation

The Churches of our Benefice have a team of Clergy and Readers who lead worship. Over the last two years we have missed a key member - Harry. His commitment to the Lord and to us shone through his generosity, ability and good sense - and stern words on occasion. (I write as the longest-serving remaining member who is available as Magazine material for August is due.) Harry's concern for people and the community both pre-dated and continued with his time as a leader of worship. He was involved in local administration, education and agricultural affairs.

A great body of Harry's family, friends and colleagues commended him with love to God's keeping at the fine Funeral Service held at Weston Church on 13th June. Weston was, of course, Harry's "home" church. He was a long-standing member of the Parochial Church Council of Weston & Denton and for his clear-sighted ability was elected vice-Chairman. He often led worship at Weston and at Denton from first becoming a Reader in the 60's. According

to the Book of Common Prayer, of course. His knowledge of the Bible was deep, nourished by the Authorised Version from which he could quote great passages from memory. (He courteously accepted my preference for modern translations and Orders of Service, on which we agreed to differ with respect both ways.) The extension of our group of churches to include Leathley and Farnley, Fewston and Blubberhouses - which brought the ministry team into being - meant that Harry would more often be accepting Sunday duty at those churches. He was firm that the pulpit was the place from which to preach the Gospel, but in his latter years his mounting and descending the steps to the one at Leathley did cause some concern for his safety! We now have a rail at the side of those steps

Harry was definitely and firmly on the Lord's side. We hold his widow, Frances, and his family in our prayers. May Harry rest in peace and rise in glory.

This has been an epic week for the Harrogate District, especially for local charities, community and voluntary groups. **THE LOCAL LOTTO for the Harrogate District has launched for ticket sales.**

Tickets for THE LOCAL LOTTO for the Harrogate District are being sold via THE LOCAL LOTTO website www.thelocalotto.co.uk which is now live for players to select their six numbers. The inaugural draw will take place on the 8th September.

As well as a £25,000 jackpot there are smaller, weekly, prizes.

The lottery is a fundraising opportunity for local voluntary and community groups, which also enables players to support the local organisations they care about most. Money raised through THE LOCAL LOTTO will contribute towards keeping the voluntary and community sector thriving across the district. The lottery is being promoted jointly by the council and [THE LOCAL FUND for the Harrogate district](#) and is being run independently by lottery manager Gatherwell.

So if the group or charity you would like to support isn't registered yet please forward this on to them and encourage them to sign up. The lottery will provide them with a guaranteed monthly income. The more tickets they sell the more the group will benefit!!

The secrets of a churchyard were revealed at our July meeting when Sally Robinson gave us a fascinating talk about the building of the Washburn Heritage Centre. When Fewston church decided to extend their church trial digs had to be made and 154 unmarked graves were found. A number of these could be identified, Sally described how the team delved into discovering the fascinating backgrounds of those found, building up a picture of life in the 19th century in the Washburn Valley. Many still had descendants living in the area who could be traced. Fewston is now seen as globally significant due to all the different records available describing this small area. Two sets of remains were chosen for facial reconstruction and it was amazing to see the faces of the man and woman. Once building work was complete a moving commemoration service was held at the reburial.

We're a very friendly WI and have walking and craft groups, and a monthly lunch club, and we welcome visitors and new members from all around the area.

In commemoration and celebration of the end of the First World War on 11th November 1918, the theme at the Washburn Heritage Centre from October 2018 to January 2019 will be 'War and the Washburn Valley', with a programme looking at aspects of both world wars and related topics.

The exhibition in the Heritage Centre for this period will be dedicated to men of the Washburn Valley who died in the service of their King and country in these two great conflicts, with information about each of the men named on the War Memorial in Fewston churchyard. All In The Month Of August

It was 100 years ago, from 8th August to 11th November that the Hundred Days Offensive in France and Belgium, took place. Allied Victory leading to the end of the 1st World War and the collapse of the German empire.

90 years ago, on 6th August 1928 that Andy Warhol, iconic American Pop artist, photographer and film-maker was born.

80 years ago, on 3rd August 1938 that Sir Terry Wogan, Irish-born radio and TV presenter was born. Popular for his droll comments, amiable banter and self-deprecating wit, he hosted BBC Radio 2 shows and the TV chat show *Wogan*. He also hosted the annual *Children in Need* telethon and game show *Blankety Blank*.

40 years ago, on 4th August 1978 that the leader of Britain's Liberal Party, Jeremy Thorpe, was charged with conspiracy to murder Norman Scott, a male model who claimed that Thorpe was his homosexual lover. Thorpe was also charged with incitement to

murder. He was acquitted in 1979, but refused to testify or explain, and the case destroyed his career and reputation.

30 years ago, on 11th August 1988 that the terrorist organisation Al-Qaeda was founded by Osama bin Laden.

25 years ago, on 4th August, 1993 that the three-year Rwandan Civil War ended with the signing of the Arusha Accords in Tanzania.

20 years ago, on 15th August 1998 that a car bomb in Omagh Northern Ireland killed 29 people and injured 370. It was the deadliest act of violence in the 30-year history of the Troubles.

15 years ago, on 5th August 2003 that the Anglican Church in America appointed its first gay bishop, prompting anger from religious leaders around the world.

10 years ago, on 8th to 24th August that the 2008 Summer Olympic Games were held in Beijing China.
