## 'Resurrection Journey' - a Lent Course

This Lent, as we discern our communal way, we also walk in a wilderness of difficult times and uncertain futures. Yet at the same time we walk towards and alongside the light and joy of Jesus's resurrection, the one who accompanies us even when we do not know it, and who opens up the Word until our hearts burn with joy and purpose.

Simon will be leading a Lent Course on Monday evenings at St Andrew's. It will commence on **Monday 23rd February**.

You may remember that for some time St Andrew's has been sponsoring a child in India through the Good Shepherd education programme of the charity DFN UK. This makes an enormous difference to the lives of the children concerned.

We have been sponsoring a girl called Riddhima. Unfortunately, Riddhima has left the school because her family have made the decision to move her to a government school closer to their home. Parents often make difficult choices to support their families especially if employment is unreliable and it is necessary for them to move area to seek other work.

We feel grateful that Riddhima has received good quality education in an environment where everyone is respected regardless of race, belief, caste or background, and that she will continue to attend school nearer to home.

We are now going to be sponsoring Filza Farhin who is 9 years old and has been attending the school since 2022. We know that Filza likes singing. Her father serves as a soldier in the Indian Army. They are a family of 4 and the family struggles to meet their basic needs. They live in a small house.

DFN UK will give us regular updates on Filza's progress and we will pass these on to you.

Wow didn't we do well!!

Many thanks to all those that contributed at our Christingle service and through the home collection boxes, helping to raise a total of £352. When the Gift Aid has been claimed this total will rise to over £400.

These funds will help The Children's Society to continue their support for young people, their families and carers and run training sessions for professionals working with children at risk.

To give you some idea of the work undertaken by the Society:

- in 2024/25 the Society supported 57,652 young people across the country through one-to-one sessions, group work, events and more
- supported 8,037 young people in early support hubs *Time for Young People* and *Pause services*
- Worked with more than 15,800 professionals, enabling them to better support children and young people at risk of abuse and harm or struggling with low wellbeing
- Ran 77 services for children, young people and their families focusing on providing early support and responding to risk.

## February Eco tip

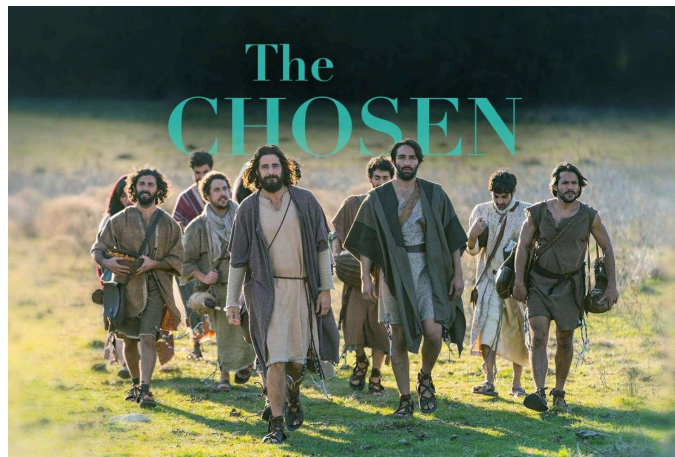

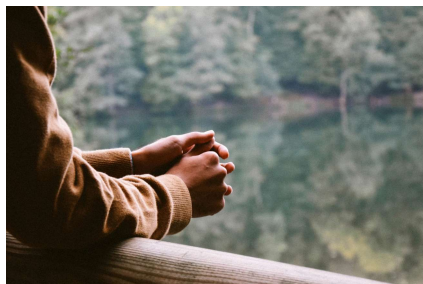
