We believe that care for God's creation and urgent action to tackle climate change, form part of our Christian calling and responsibility.

At Wesley, we are committed to showing our care for God's creation in all we do. We embarked on our Eco-Church journey to help us learn more about how we can do this - as a community, in our building, in the city and the world around us, and in our own lifestyles.

We were delighted to gain a Bronze Eco-Church award early in 2021 and even more thrilled to achieve a Silver Eco-Church award in January 2024.

We are now working across all groups and generations in the Wesley community to raise awareness, to encourage and inspire change, and to do everything we can to care for God's creation.

We hope this will be transformative for us as a church community and also for the lives of our members, visitors to the church centre, the wider life of our city, and beyond.

May 2022	Two members of the group attended the Chester and Stoke on Trent Methodist District Synod as observers, and shared their experiences of the eco-church journey with others from across the District.  Beginning of process of tendering for professional consultation on reduction of carbon impact of whole Church premises.
July 2022	Further eco-service led by members of the group. This focussed on individual lifestyles and changes made.
September 2022	Joint meeting held with Church Council. The eco -group, joined by others from Churches Together, ran a stall at the sustainability fair in Grosvenor Park, which was part of Great Big Green Week.
October 2022	Church Council agreed to commission a professional energy and decarbonisation audit of whole Church premises.
November 2022	Eco-group leading mini-series of discussion meetings on zoom focussing on current controversial issues in the climate debate.
December 2022	Communal Christmas greetings among the congregation in aid of The Arches Wildlife and Wellbeing Garden
January 2023	Eco Group hosted vegan church lunch and conversation  Meeting with Cllr Delaney to discuss possible grant funding

A small eco-group began working in 2020 and this has led to some significant steps. As a first task, we undertook the audit of energy and fittings within the Church buildings, as well as of materials such as cleaning products used on the premises. We also analysed the frequency of themes of creation and environment within our services, as well as looking at issues of personal lifestyle and political engagement on environmental matters. On the basis of this audit, we were delighted to gain a Bronze Eco-church award early in 2021. After further work we were awarded a Silver Eco-church award in January 2024. We are trying to help members to think about the environmental impact of their own lifestyles. A survey was conducted in 2021.

The group have worked closely with SPLAT (the Church's children and young people's groups) and aim to involve them as much as possible in projects undertaken. SPLAT are very enthusiastic about this. We are also working with the support of the Church leadership team and the administrative committee.

2021 saw an important date with the COP 26 conference in Glasgow. The eco -group worked towards this with a Climate Sunday service held on April 25th, which had Deborah Tomkins of Green Christian as the speaker. An eco-harvest service was held on Oct 31st, just before COP 26. The convenor of the eco-group regularly attended training from the 'Make COP 26 count' organisation. Steps are now being taken towards a full professional audit of the Church premises, and the work of the group within the Church is becoming more widely known through Methodist, ecumenical and local channels.
