Nearest to the Cambridgeshire border, and practically a suburb of Wisbech, is Walsoken, which has the finest Norman nave and chancel of any parish church in Norfolk. Aisles (14th cent.) and a fifteenth century clerestory have been added, and a spire to the fine western tower. The roof has coloured figures on the helves. There are sixteen of these, and most are Apostles. A large figure is over the western arch. The font has the Seven Sacraments and Crucifixion on the bowl and saints round the inscribed base, of whom these are distinguishable: Magdalene, Stephen, Mary, and Paul, Katherine, Peter, Dorothy. There is also a good piece of screen-work, and some extremely fine bench-ends.
