Come together for a beer or a cuppa and learn about St Giles Church History from local historian Mike Ingram.



The Ruthless Elimination of Hurry



In these last 2 weeks, the Big Church Read drew us to the closing chapters on **Simplicity** and then **Slowing** in the Ruthless Elimination of Hurry*. Drawing on the teaching of Jesus about money and wealth, John Mark Comer writes:-

Wealth has a suffocating effect on the soil of my heart, choking out the life of the kingdom... shopping is now the number one leisure activity in America, usurping the place previously held by religion... materialism has sped up our society to a frenetic, untenable pace.

In drawing us back to the core discipleship teaching of Jesus, John Mark confronts us with the challenge of whether we are being moulded and shaped by the culture around us or by Jesus, His teaching and the Scriptures. **This is the very heart of the book.** It has helped me to see exactly what Jesus meant

when he said, "What good will it be for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul?" Matthew 16v26

I think this is a book some of us will end up returning to again and again. Because at the heart of it all it's an invitation to enter in to **life in all its fullness** and to walk an **ancient and good path** with Jesus (Jer 6v16). I'll leave you with a quote from the final chapter P222.

Our apprenticeship to Jesus has to be a whole-person endeavour. Mind and body. If we can slow down both, the pace at which we think and the pace at which we move our bodies through the world, maybe we can slow down our souls to a pace at which they can "taste and see that the LORD is good." Ps 34v8
