Ministerial Musings

St. Francis of Assisi is remembered on October 4th. In most people's minds he is the patron saint of animals and birds and there are many pictures of him surrounded by all sorts of creatures.

However, there's much more to Francis than this. He was a most unlikely candidate for being made a saint. He was born in the late twelfth century, the son of a wealthy merchant. He liked the high life and wore expensive clothes. He was very much one of the lads and his life was one of pleasure seeking.

In 1202 Francis became a soldier at a time when Italian city states made war on each other. He was captured and kept a prisoner for a year, during which time he became ill. After his recovery whilst on his way to join another army, he had a dream in which he was told to return to Assisi. He did so and devoted his time to fasting and prayer.

One famous story about Francis is that he went to pray in the ruined church of St. Damiano and heard a voice which seemed to come from a cross, telling him to rebuild "my church". He hurried home, took some of his father's rolls of cloth and sold them. He gave the money to the priest who refused to take it. Francis threw it out of the window. His father was furious and tried to bring him before the authorities. Francis refused so his father brought him before the Bishop. Francis stripped himself of all his clothes so that he had nothing of his father's. He renounced worldly goods and family ties. He identified with the poor. He rebuilt the church of St. Damiano and some others too. He began preaching outside church buildings, which as a layman he was not supposed to do. Others were attracted to him and he sought the Pope's blessing on his group. Thus the Franciscan order of friars was established. They not only embraced poverty but sought to live a life of sacrifice for others. He tried to make the Bible understandable to ordinary people. We can thank him for our Nativity scenes because he set one up with real animals.

Francis had a great respect for the natural world. He called the sun his brother and the moon his sister. Perhaps if we feel overwhelmed by the environmental problems of our age we can remember what he said. "Start by doing what's necessary, then what's possible, and suddenly you are doing the impossible."

You are welcome to join us at any of our services.

Holy Communion is celebrated every Sunday at one or other of the Chet Valley Churches, either Book of Common Prayer or Common Worship, with an informal Holy Communion service once a month in Chedgrave.

Services of **Morning Worship** are held in Loddon and Hardley.

XPRESSIONS CAFÉ is on the first Sunday every month at All Saints, Chedgrave. This is a relaxed and contemporary way of 'doing church'. Open between 10am and 12 noon, you can come and go as you please for coffee, cake, discussion, crafts, games, stories, reflection and much more.

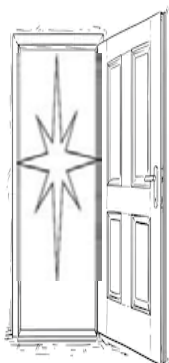

All borrowed items will be automatically renewed until further notice, and we are asking people to keep library books at home for the time being. You will not be charged overdue fees, and any existing charges, as of 17 March, will not increase over time. This covers all items, including books, DVDs and music. Unfortunately, you will not be able to reserve items, or request inter-library loans whilst our libraries are closed.

From home you can join the Library via the Norfolk County Council website. If you have a library card but can't remember your PIN, email libraries@norfolk.gov.uk. You can download a range of eBooks, eAudio books, eNewspapers, and eMagazines from a range of different apps, including Libby, Overdrive, Zinio and PressReader. THE SISLAND CHRONICLE - **Hot News** On 7th August BBC said it was 31c. (88f.) at 5pm in Loddon, In Sisland we clocked 35c.(95f.) at 2pm, 33c. (93f.) at 5pm!

Harvest was mostly completed and in store by the end of August. Large grain lorries are once more having to negotiate some of the sharp corners in our lanes. Grain quality and quantity seems variable, the weather again. Shortages of bread wheat may affect prices when it comes to loaves of bread. Wheat, cropping at an average of 3.4 tonnes per acre will end up as 5,780 loaves of bread, so a 30% drop in the crop can be quite serious. Grain from abroad also helps to feed their rising populations, so import costs may rise. Food is a vital commodity and much can be done to raise awareness about how it is grown. 'Country file' the other Sunday was a revelation in public relations between children and farmers. Over 500 farmers are regularly in contact via social media with schools, showing crops on their mobile phones, and explaining what is going on to children in their classrooms. The children's are full of interest, one farmer said that after a season of crops he was surprised how quite young children were extremely knowledgeable, asking increasingly complex questions about farm operations! a splendid portent for the future. Visitors are welcome to come for a quiet time in Sisland Church, but because of Corvid 19, it is only open occasionally, see the Chet Churches website for details. How-ever, the car park and Churchyard are always open, and there are seats to rest.

Hi, Freddie here. I sometimes have to stay at home when T. & J. go shopping – I love going, lots of nice smells, but I'm not allowed into most shops. A short History of Hardley Mill

One hundred years ago windmills working alongside our rivers to drain the adjoining marshes were a common sight. Hardley Windmill was one such drainage pump operating beside the River Yare..

The mill was built in 1874 for Sir Thomas Proctor Beauchamp of Langley Hall (now Langley School) by Ludham millwright Daniel England. It operated until around 1950 when it was tail winded and badly damaged

In 1991, with the mill derelict, volunteers under the inspirational leadership of architect and mill enthusiast Peter Grix started work on restoration. By 2005 structural work on the tower was complete. With the award of funding from Leader+ in 2007/08 work on the cap and sails moved on apace. The cap was lifted onto the top of the tower in April 2009 and the sails finally turned on 9th October 2009.

The internal workings were completed in 2013, with the mill pumping water again under sail power for the first time in over 70 years.

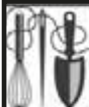

Local wildlife groups have come together to create a 3 km wide pollinator friendly corridor along the Chet from its source in Poringland to the Yare. Pollinators as with much wildlife have suffered from loss of habitat and the way we use land. There are things we can do though to turn things around and we are pleased that Loddon and Chedgrave now have a number of projects linked to the B-Line.

What you can do to help:

- **Avoid harmful pesticides**-Synthetic pesticides are harmful to bees. Using them in your garden can not only keep bees away, but also endanger their lives. If you must treat your garden, opt for organic pesticide options and spray at night when pollinators are least active. We are pleased that Chedgrave Allotments have gone pesticide free. Herbicides can also kill wildflowers vital for food.
- **Plant pollinator friendly flowers**-Wildflowers are best as they and the pollinators have developed together over thousands of years, but many other common garden plants are just as good. Look out for the RHS plants for pollinators symbol. Try to plant flowers in patches - bees like to focus on one flower type at a time. Bees are becoming active earlier in the year and early spring flowering trees, shrubs and bulbs are particularly useful. Top Tip: the best shrub for spring is Blackthorn, which flowers just as the hungry Queen Bumble Bees wake up.
- **Provide a home**-A source of water is important for all wildlife, whether it's a pond or a bird bath. Leave an area of long grass, cut it down once a year in autumn or not at all. An undisturbed plot will help many insects, including ground-nesting bees. The tree bumblebee often uses bird boxes, but there are also leaf cutter bees and mason bees that live in holes in wood and in brick walls.

Top tip: the South Yare Wildlife Group website is great for advice. www.southyarewildlifegroup.org

Be(e) involved. We need your help. We are recruiting for help with a range of tasks; promoting the aims of the project by speaking to Councils, local clubs and societies; advising on pollinator friendly gardening; lobbying for change; helping with planting projects; monitoring and recording pollinator numbers. Training provided where necessary.

Bergh Apton Conservation Trust is leading this project with support from South Yare Wildlife Group, Norfolk Wildlife Trust, Buglife, Farming and Wildlife Advisory Group .

Recent news and a big thank you!

All 3 medical practices in the Chet Valley B-line pollinator corridor have joined us. Heathgate and Old Mill in Poringland and Loddon Surgery was one of our first planting schemes. All have new pollinator friendly grass cutting regimes. A survey at Old Mill in Poringland by South Yare Wildlife Group members identified 60 wildflower species and saw (the increasingly rare) Common Blue butterfly.

Loddon & District Local History Group

Sadly again I have no monthly meeting to report. but August was an interesting and busy month. We have been having regular contact Robin & Laura re the Archive Project and an initial virtual face to face meeting with them on September 2nd.

We heard from the Loddon Library Manager, busy resorting the shelves in preparation for the reopening the Library, that our Archive Material, would need to go from the Local Studies Room We have been fortunate to have the use of this room for many years, and it has enabled access to the Archive Material whenever the Library was open. Sadly the albums, files and boxes are now removed and currently in temporary storage with Carol & me. The plus side is that for the first time in five months can get on with updating the catalogue and digitising pictures etc.

To help with this work we are looking for volunteers; to type up handwritten lists of contents of albums/files and to help in listing the contents of others. Interest and enthusiasm to enter text into a prepared Excel sheet required. The reward is getting a close look at some of the interesting photographs and /or information in the archive.

Over the years Michael Gunton, who died in April, had collected many photographs and ephemera of local interest, which he had generously shared with us. His collection has been donated to the History Group and is currently being merged with our own Archive. We are very grateful to his family for this donation.

From the Archive this month is brief. Woods Sadd Moore had a long running milling business in Loddon. But what of the gentlemen themselves?

Mr Arthur C Sadd 4th son of a Suffolk farmer had moved to Loddon by 1891 and lived for over 20 years at the Beeches, he was described as Merchant, Maltster & Miller. Sons Neville and Henry joined the family business and also lived in Loddon at the Beeches and East Hill respectively. Incidentally East Hill was built adjacent to the brick Tower Mill, just as it was demolished. A picture of the mill was in Michael Gunton's collection. Mr Alfred Woods 1827-1912 who in 1893 was described as senior member of the firm; originated in Lowestoft and learned the trade of a tailor later moving to London running a successful business as a dressmaker & costumier. By 1888 he also owned Elm Farm, but retired to Ingate St. Beccles becoming Mayor in 1891. Presumably he helped to finance the company. Mr W H Moore 1860-194 is more of a mystery. He appears to have been a young American who married Amelia Cross, the sister in law of Arthur Sadd in 1884, the marriage ended in divorce in 1903 and he returned to America, taking their children with him despite his wife having custody. She followed, to be reunited with her children.

Read Any Good Books Lately?

“One Thousand Moons,” by Sebastian Barry

A very unusually written book - written as if the central character (a young native American girl) is the narrator. Her tribe was massacred when she was very young, but she wasn't killed, although the rest of her family were. She was rescued by two English men and brought up by them and an Indian woman, with whom she still lives. This extraordinary book has a background of distrust between the white Americans and the native Indians as well as between different tribes and different kinds of love. All of this is set in a rural part of America two centuries ago. At times it isn't easy to read because of the unusual narrative, but it is really thought provoking.

“The Lost Lights of St. Kilda,” by Elisabeth Gifford

In 1930 the tiny Hebridean island of St. Kilda was evacuated because there were so few able-bodied inhabitants (many of whom were very elderly) that they couldn't grow sufficient food for everyone, and boats were no longer bringing post or items to help with the day-to-day survival of the island. Consequently the tiny population was relocated to the Glasgow area of Scotland 90 years ago.

This novel transports the reader to a feeling of being one of those islanders, it is written so well. The central character is a woman called Chrissie Gillies, a single parent of a now teenage girl, who has begun to ask questions about her father; as a result of that the story of Chrissie and a Cambridge University student unfolds. The author sometimes tells the story from Chrissie's viewpoint and sometimes from the view of Fred, the student. The story takes us right up to the end of World War 2 and just beyond. It is totally absorbing and all the more so because of its unusual setting.

“Old Baggage,” by Lissa Evans

This could easily be one of the best books you have read for a very long time! Set in London (Hampstead) in the time shortly after the activity of the Suffragettes, the author has created a wonderful selection of characters of various ages. Most importantly there is Mattie Simkin, who lives right near Hampstead Heath with a friend called Florrie Lee, who is a Health Visitor. Mattie is a force to be reckoned with and is dedicated to seeing that the younger generation of girls should never grow up to be subservient to any man: they should be educated, not simply domesticated!

There is much humour in the text as well as love, compassion and fierce determination. At the end there is sadness - but also optimism for the future in the person of a very small boy...

“Any Human Heart,” by William Boyd

The life story of (fictional) Logan Mountstuart. This is written as if it comprised entries in a journal. According to the author, Mountstuart was born in 1906 and lives for 85 years. During that time he is a fairly rebellious schoolboy, bored by the Sixth Form years, but with two particular friendships featuring the same two friends for nearly all of his life. He becomes a writer and develops a very knowledgeable interest in Art, as well as having liaisons with several women - some more meaningful and successful than others. William Boyd doesn't hesitate to introduce his character to real people, in particular the Prince of Wales and Mrs. Wallis. Mountstuart becomes a spy during World War 2 and is imprisoned in Switzerland. Later he goes from wealth to poverty in London, Paris, the USA, back to London and eventually to a small village in France. He is an interesting character to have been created, with an eventful life story. There are times when reading this novel can be a bit hard-going – not, however, during the final few years.

Nature Notes

Writing these notes in early September it has been very noticeable how the transition from Summer to Autumn appears to have happened overnight. Daylight hours are also visibly shrinking. This morning I was reminded that at any time you can see the unexpected that can lift your spirit, for me it was watching a Hobby maneuvering acrobatically while it failed to catch a small bird. It was only in my eyeline for a few seconds, definitely a “wow” moment to my morning.

Our lockdown garden bird list is up to 79, both additions seen through the kitchen window in our Buddleia . The first a Reed Warbler and the second a couple of Willow Warblers, the latter are much more colourful than the usual Chiff Chaffs we see.

Autumn migration is now in full swing and there have been various birds up and down the Norfolk/Suffolk coast, though I have refrained from going on any twitch to date. Early in August there were good numbers of Pied Flycatchers around, unfortunately the males are no longer in their resplendent black and white plumage. Last Spring, I was fortunate to see a male bird in Lowestoft while walking from where I had parked my car to the opticians and again on the return journey. Normally you would have to travel west to see such a sight.

I did venture to Winterton in the first week of September to give the dogs some sea air. There had been some Skuas and Shearwaters passing down the coast earlier in the week. I did not actually hold out much hope as the wind now was in the wrong direction for good sea watching. Having scanned the horizon from the dunes for a while and shared my lunch with the dogs I decided to let them have a run on the beach. It was then that I saw some Sandwich Terns noisily flying over the water. Their calls became more agitated and I realized that something else was around and quickly discovered an Artic Skua giving chase to them. The skua was not that persistent and quickly gave up and settled onto the sea, giving me good views. For the last four days a White Winged Black Tern has been at Cantley so on two consecutive days the dogs had a walk from Hardley Staithe towards Hardley Mill. I reckoned that I would be able to see it as long as it was flying, and sure enough I was successful on the second trip. That is not the first time I have viewed a rare bird that was at Cantley from our side of the river. A few years back I was able to see a Sea Eagle there perched on a gate post from near the end of Langley Dyke.

Once more, but only the once, I have seen a bat at the bottom of the garden while shutting the chickens in for the night. We are now in a period when anything could turn up, especially along the coast, curlew sandpipers, little stint, spotted redshank, osprey, red backed shrike, wryneck plus a variety of warblers are all around now. Think I might just head out with the dogs again.

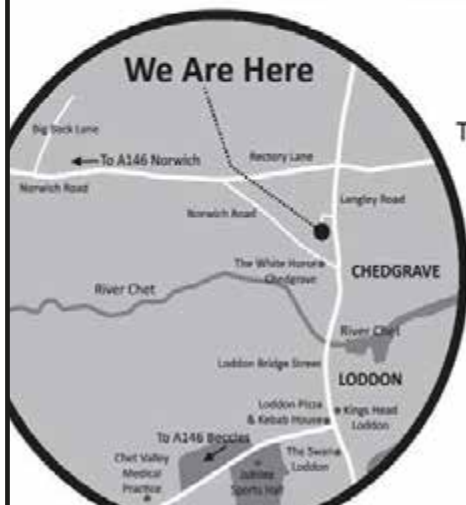

We Are Here



From the Garden

This month I shall finish planting bulbs in pots, using a mixture of hyacinths in blues and cream or maybe yellow, with smaller pots planted with crocus and lily of the valley. I think fragrance in a garden is as important as colour especially by the front door. All my bulb planting will be in pots this autumn as I am moving to a new garden, well a new house with an area that will become a garden.

We've seen deer in the new garden and found chewed bluebells leaves earlier in the year, so I have been checking the internet to find plants that deer don't like. The RHS advises they tend not to eat hellebores, herbaceous peonies, rhubarb, skimmia and jasmine, so not a big choice. I have not grown peonies before, but I have discovered several very colourful and fragrant varieties, Bowl of Beauty and Eden's Perfume have caught my eye. The deer society suggests providing native plants, such as brambles, rosebay willowherb, dandelion, campion and yarrow for the deer to eat instead, these will also benefit other wildlife in your garden.

It will be exciting to start a garden from scratch, garden designs have changed so much over the last 50 years - summer bedding is less formal and we are able to buy and grow many more exotic plants, perhaps too much choice!

From the Allotment

I was recently asked where to obtain old Norfolk apple varieties. So for anyone else interested here is the web site <http://www.applesandorchards.org.uk/>. The Apple and Orchards Project is based near Fakenham and you will be surprised how many old local apples there are. At the moment, they are giving free trees to Norfolk schools. Order now for winter delivery when the trees are dormant. After recent winds firm the soil around your Brussels sprouts and check if they need staking. October is usually the last month for harvesting autumn raspberries, runners, courgettes, and squashes. Your pumpkins can be safely harvested and stored once they are a deep orange and ring hollow. Leave a long stalk and keep in a sunny place for about 10 days to develop a tough skin then store until Halloween or required. They can last a couple of months in a cool garage.

It is also the time seed catalogues pour through the door (earlier every year I think), but spare a thought for local suppliers like Loddon Garden and DIY who also stock a large range of seeds, bulbs, plants and other sundries. Andrew Carver kept serving through lock down and kept many of us going, sourcing plants and materials at a time of scarcity demonstrating the value of local shops. The shop itself opens soon making it easier to browse the seed packets.
