## Food Bank—Annual Roundup

Barry Gibson manages our links with the Food Bank. He writes: “During the past year we have collected 132 trays of food, each of which have 30lbs of food in them. This is enough to feed 264 people facing crisis, for three days. From our distribution point we have helped 122 local people during the year—single people, couples and families. The increase on 2019 was 60% almost entirely due to Covid. Thank-you to all who have given to the Food Bank over the last twelve months.” Please continue to donate food. You can leave donations in the box just inside the door at the Co-op in Loddon.


## Rosemary Morison
