Ministerial Musings

“This is my commandment: love one another, as I have loved you. A man can have no greater love than to lay down his life for his friends” - John 15:12

The one thing that every Christian knows is that those who have been baptised into the life, death and resurrection of Christ Jesus are to “love one another, since”, as St John reminds us, “love comes from God, and anyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God” (1Jn4:7).

What many of the baptised often forget, however, is that the love that we are to have for one another is not meant to be a generic, nondescript love, a love according either to our own vague understanding of what love is or of what the overly fickle world thinks love should be, but a love which is distinctive, indeed distinctively Christian, for the love that baptised Christians are to have for one another is not only a love which keeps those commandments given to us by Christ Jesus, who himself kept his Father’s commandments, it is also a love which is perfectly modelled on the love that God himself has for each and every one of us.

St John reminds us, lest we forget, that “God’s love for us was revealed when God sent into the world his only son” (1Jn4:8), and indeed God’s love for us was revealed still further when that same Son, in obedience to the Father’s Will, was sent to the Cross for our salvation, becoming the sacrifice that takes our sins away and giving his life “so that we could have life through him” (1Jn4:9).

When Jesus said to his disciples, therefore, and not simply said but gave them his commandment, that they are to “love one another, as I have loved you” it ought to be clear that the love Jesus was commanding his disciples to have for one another was nothing other, and, more importantly, nothing less, than the greatest love anyone can have, loving to the extent that one is willing to lay down their life for their friends, just as Christ Jesus laid down his life for each and every one of us.

Holy Communion is celebrated every Sunday at one or other of the Chet Valley Churches, either Book of Common Prayer or Common Worship, with an informal Holy Communion service once a month in Chedgrave.

Services of **Morning Worship** are held in Loddon and Hardley.

XPRESSIONS CAFÉ is on the first Sunday every month at All Saints, Chedgrave. This is a relaxed and contemporary way of 'doing church'. Open between 10:00am and 12 noon, you can come and go as you please for coffee, cake, discussion, crafts, games, stories, reflection and much more.

All Together Worship is on the third Sunday every month, starting at 11:00am at All Saints, Chedgrave (January, March, June and September are followed by shared lunch).

News From Your South Norfolk District Councillor



Hi everyone.

Our Chetchat group continues to go from strength to strength; our next ChetChat event will be a sponsored walk from Loddon to Hardley Mill in the afternoon of **Saturday 18 September**, which will raise money for our group and for very important local causes. I hope that as many of you as possible are able to join us for some refreshments at the mill. Thanks to Musker McIntyre, and to Rosy Lee's, for jointly sponsoring the event.

As mentioned last month, South Norfolk, working with the Chet Valley B-Line project, have identified sites in Loddon in which they are planning to leave some areas uncut, as part of the 'Don't Mow, Let It Grow' initiative. The areas are: Leman Grove, Harvey Green, Gilbert Grove, Filbert Road, The Staithe and Pyes Mill.

I'm also looking at whether it could be possible to establish a community bank in Loddon, with High Street banks sharing the running costs. This has been tried successfully in other parts of the country, so it is definitely something which is worth looking into.

My regular surgeries will start up again later this Summer, by which time it should be safe to hold them again. In the meantime, please ring me anytime on 07733 323581 if I can help you.

Loddon and Chedgrave Playing Field Committee

Chedgrave and Loddon PC's jointly share responsibility for the Playing Field. Below is a brief summary of work the Committee has implemented in the last year;

The Tennis Courts have been cleared of moss and the leylandii trimmed back.

An online booking system (www.loddonpc.org.uk/tennis-courts) has been set up to allow people to book the tennis courts at any time.

The area near the containers which had caused concern with its antisocial behaviour has been cleared of vegetation, trees and sharps.

A joint CCTV venture between the users of the Playing Field and the Jubilee Hall has been agreed, and it is hoped that it will reduce vandalism and dog fouling issues.

A significant grant has been obtained from the Lawn Tennis Association to install a keycode system to make the Tennis Courts booking process simpler.

Firstly, thanks to Cllr June Strickland, our outgoing Chairman for her unwavering support to both staff and Councillors, we look forward to working with the new Chairman. Despite the Pandemic, the Council has worked hard to improve the facilities and services that Loddon Parish Council is able to offer the community.

LPC wish to thank all volunteers over the past year; Patrick Webster & Gary Allard for the recent restoration of the two wooden village notice boards, Carole & Bernard Webb for installing tree plaques. The Freedom of Loddon Award will continue for a further ten years, thanks to a generous sponsor; Philip Taylor. Also thanks to Sophie Garrett & Brian Webb for caring for the village flower towers.

Thanks to District Cllr Kay Mason-Billig for offering her Members' Grant to cover the cost of a CCTV system at the Staithe toilets. The CCTV has reduced antisocial behaviour and is supporting the Police when crime and vandalism is reported.

Additionally, the Council has:

- Adopted 30 streetlights from SNC and upgraded those streetlights to LED lanterns to reduce energy supply costs.

- Worked closely with SNC to improve the Staithe and are delighted to receive the news that SNC have taken responsibility for the Staithe footbridge.

- Sourced further Freedom of Loddon Plaques.

- Improved the management of the allotments, including a new scaled plan, plot signs and the newly formed Allotment Officer role. There is now a healthy waiting list for Loddon Allotments.

- Nearly completed adoption of the public open space on Broadlands Meadow.

- New signage for the Staithe WCs.

- Progressed a joint Neighbourhood Plan with Chedgrave Parish Council.

The Council supported the Royal British Legion in organising the Remembrance Sunday event, and despite Covid concerns, it was a very poignant occasion. The Council were grateful to Caroline Dwen and her volunteers for providing additional marshal support to ensure that the event was Covid-19 safe, and we are hopeful that this year, the full parade will be able to go ahead without any restrictions.

The 2020 Christmas light display was as impressive as always. The community offered consent to display lights and provided electrical supplies for the installation and thank to Loddon Swan for donating a village Christmas Tree. Plans are well underway for the 2021 Christmas light display.

The LPC website and Facebook page are updated regularly. Minutes of meetings are on the website and residents are welcome to attend the monthly meetings.

Notes from Sisland

During the last couple of these entries, I have noted that the weather while I have been writing has been variable and today is no different, as the beautiful sunshine this morning has been replaced with what appears to be rain and sleet.

Some of you may have seen details of the Churches Count on Nature which is an initiative promoted by Caring for God's Acre, A Rocha UK, the Church of England and the Church in Wales. During a week in June, it aims to bring people together to discover the wildlife in their local church yard. Sisland has always been an active promotor of conservation and wildlife in its churchyard. There are two Norfolk Wildlife Trust Conservation Area signs in the churchyard to the south of the church. The whole of the area to the South side of the church and bounded by the newly planted hedge to the West, are part of the current conservation area.

We were incredibly fortunate that Norfolk Wildlife Trust completed four surveys of the churchyard on 27 March 2019, 25 April 2019, 23 May 2019 and 23 July 2019. Their report was presented to the PCC and the surveyors noted that "Sisland churchyard is a lovely, peaceful place and it is obviously well-cared for, with many lovely wildflowers present, reflecting the old meadow flora of Norfolk. Churchyards are the single most important refuge for many wildflowers typical of old meadows in Norfolk. The churchyard at Sisland can boast of supporting four of the six 'churchyard dependent' wildflower species – meadow saxifrage, oxeye daisy, lady's bedstraw and burnet saxifrage - these are native species which have at least 50% of their Norfolk population in churchyards". The survey also highlighted the other wildlife seen during the visit. This included Orange Tip, Small Copper, Meadow Brown and a number of Gatekeeper and Peacock butterflies. If you have an opportunity to visit our beautiful churchyard in late spring and early summer, you will be able to enjoy these special flowers and wildlife for yourself.

In addition, if you have visited or driven past recently you may also have noticed that one of the windows on the south side of the church is currently boarded up. At the last visit from the church architect, it was noted that the lead had become loose and needed repairing. The glaziers were able to remove the window and take it to their workshop to be cleaned, repaired and fresh ventilation gauze added before it is put back, hopefully towards the end of May. We hope to start further fundraising later in the year as there are some other parts of the church building needing maintenance.



Electric and Hybrid Cars

It seems that hybrid and electric cars have caught people's attention as we have received some more comments since the May edition was delivered:

I switched to a hybrid car in 2016 and they have got better and better. I have driven a Toyota Auris and now a Toyota Corolla which is quiet and runs as an electric vehicle a great deal of the time on local short journeys. Even sitting in traffic jams on the motorway it sits quietly only having the petrol engine kick in when recharging is needed. I will consider fully electric in the future once costs come down and there are more and quicker charging points. For now the fuel economy is quite good at 52 -60 miles per gallon combined overall (urban and long journeys). There are some good offers out there in paying per month and a fairly new secondhand hybrid can be great—environmentally better than diesel or just petrol and a real pleasure to drive, with acceleration oomph when needed (unlike earlier models).

The Toyota Hybrid Yaris 2019 is the second Hybrid Yaris I've had and is similar to the Auris and Corolla but a little smaller. It's excellent for town or city driving as it runs a lot on electricity: It just switches between the two automatically, no need to think about it! I also have an automatic gearbox which makes it very easy and relaxing to drive. I have done long drives too—across France—and have found it very comfortable, reliable and easy to refuel. It's refuelled as usual with normal petrol so there is no waiting for it to be charged like an electric car. It is said to do up to about 55 to 60mpg. Another little advantage is that the annual tax is also a little less.

I bought my electric Zoe (Renault) during lockdown in 2020. I really enjoy driving it—it is a nippy little car though I usually drive it on 'eco' which is slightly less quick at the getaway but more economical. So far I have only been able to do relatively short distances because of Covid. I think I will be confident to take it out for longer distances when we can do that. The Zap Map app shows where chargers are in the country, but, not only that, you can also see whether they are currently in use, available to use, or out of action. At some of the chargers you can pay with your debit card, just like buying petrol or diesel—again that is information available from the app. As the government was giving grants for electric cars when I bought mine, I had a free charger installed at home so 'filling up' is very easy—I just plug it in when it gets down to around 15-20% charge and leave it for a few hours by which time it is back to the recommended 80%. If you are going to drive a long distance, then you can charge it up to 100% which gives you about 240 miles when it is warm and about 180 miles in the winter. My cynical oldest son said, "Ah, so you have swapped from oil to coal to fuel your driving." I took the wind out of his sails when I told him the car would soon be powered by the sun! (We are installing some solar panels this year).

We wondered if anyone would like to offer their thoughts on other electric vehicles. Whilst the Zoe has won the best small electric car award for several years in a row, there must be other models that are out in our community. Do let us know.



Covid kids—A Personal Assessment from a Tutor

“The pandemic is crushing our children.” - “Our children will never recover.” - “Exams limbo has sent anxiety soaring.” - “Lockdown mental health problems in one in six youngsters.”

Initial findings

In fact, discerning the true state of mental health through the pandemic is hard to do. As The Lancet recently acknowledged, “Few studies around the world cover children.” The evidence we have is mixed. A study of 168 children in the east of England, with an average age of 10, found an increase in depressive symptoms. However, a study of about 1000 children aged 13 and 14 in south-west England found little overall change in anxiety, depression and well-being.

What my pupils have taught me

As a maths tutor I learn much from my pupils. I have been impressed with their resilience and adaptability during a strange and difficult year. In spite of school closures and exam cancellations, many of my pupils have been positive and hopeful. Many have been even more eager to learn.

The most resilient generation in decades?

I am quietly optimistic that Covid kids may emerge stronger through the pandemic. Research shows that resilience comes from challenges and emerging even stronger. A soft, easy childhood is not necessarily the gift we imagine it to be. Today's children are learning to deal with feeling anxious, bored, lonely, worried, confused and more. They have more to deal with than is always visible. Far from crushing them, Covid could be the force that helps lead this generation to become the most resilient



Loddon and District Local History Group

Still no meetings to announce, but after working on my contribution for this month an idea is coming into my head. I hope you have all seen the latest display in Young's window, our thanks to Colin Hartley for this.

Over a period of 12 years, groups, organised by Chris Crease & Carol Carpenter (as she then was), descended upon a local churchyard armed with clipboards, pencils, scrubbing brushes, water, sunscreen and packed lunches. The churchyards had been divided into areas and each grave stone had a coded marker giving its row and number. After a quick briefing where recording sheets were distributed, we set to work usually in pairs recording the information on the stones. The results of the surveys can be researched on our website at <http://www.loddonhistory.org.uk/>. There should be a copy available at each of the churches.

The survey at Hales was done in 2010. Below is an updated piece I wrote in 2011:

There are services in the ancient church at Hales only once or twice a year. The churchyard is still used for burials. The stones which caught my attention are to the left as you enter the gate. Although the Nonconformists had their separate places of worship the parish churchyard was their final resting place.

John Hammond, whose stone had fallen, was a Primitive Methodist Minister. John was born in Hales the son of Thomas a farmer, and Ann, who lived in Church Lane. By 1861 he was working as a miller and on census day was visiting the King family in Lowestoft. In 1867 he married Matilda King and they started his ministry away from Hales. Two children were born in Norwich, one in Gravesend, one in Stepney and one in Colchester before they appear on the 1881 census in Cambridge. He died in the Loddon area in 1889, and Matilda moved back to her mother in Lowestoft with the children and died in 1915.

Further to the left is line of tombs and graves of the Spurgeon family, for many years at Hales Hall. Lorinda Spurgeon caused problems when her name was written in parish registers, one can only hope it is spelled correctly on her tomb. The tomb next to Lorinda's is that of her daughter Louisa the wife of William Batley born in Newton Norfolk, another Primitive Methodist Minister, he died in 1860 on his probate entry described as a shopkeeper in Yarmouth. Louisa returned to Hales and died there 4th March 1867. Louisa's brother Amos married Tabitha Blunderfield Riches from Loddon in 1864, again the Blunderfields and Riches were significant members of the Loddon Methodist movement. When Tabitha died in Beccles in 1909 the executors of her will were her grandson Henry Amos Spurgeon and a Richard William Burnett another Primitive Methodist minister husband of her granddaughter Rosa.

Norfolk has always been known for its nonconformity and our 19th century local families certainly kept up the tradition.

Read Any Good Books Lately?

“A book is a dream that you hold in your hand,” Neil Gaiman

“Miss Benson’s Beetle,” by Rachel Joyce.

An utterly extraordinary story, written by one of our most interesting and imaginative current authors. At the end of the book Rachel Joyce has written an explanation of what prompted her to write it - that, too, is well worth reading. The central characters are two women, one (Miss Benson) much older than the other and they are totally unlike each other. The idea of there ever being a friendship between them seems preposterous to both of them - and, indeed, to anyone else who comes across them - but it doesn't do to make assumptions sometimes. Circumstances find them travelling together to New Caledonia in order to find an insect which has never before been found: a golden beetle. If that's not an unusual concept on which to base a novel, I'm not quite sure what is! It has certainly worked for Rachel Joyce, who has given us a fascinating and a deeply touching few hours of sheer enjoyment.

“Call for the Dead,” by John le Carré.

This was John le Carré's first 'George Smiley' book. It is, of course, well written, but it's not something to be read in a hurry. The author's books often have very complex plots and this is definitely an example of such a one! Politics, the Secret Service and a touch of racism all feature in this intriguing book and give an idea of what was to come from Le Carré's pen in his later novels. Be warned, though: however interesting, it could well be possible to reach the end of the story without having fully understood everything...

“The Unexpected Return of Josephine Fox,” by Claire Gradidge.

The basis of this novel is the story of a middle-aged woman whose mother died without ever telling her daughter who her father was. It begins with a small gang of children in the time of World War I who meet together frequently and whose families are mostly impoverished. Josephine is one of them and was brought up by her Grandmother even though her Grandfather was ashamed of her and very unkind to her, as she was born out of wedlock. He always referred to her as a bastard. At this period of time Josephine's home life was so unhappy that she left home as soon as possible and made her own way in life, finding what jobs she could for herself in London. Much later on, during World War II, having learned of her mother's death, she decides to return to the place where she was born in order to find out who her father was. Her search involves her in meeting with her family again and with adults of her own age who were once members of the same childhood gang as she was. One of them, who has grown up to become the local Coroner, takes her on as his assistant. From then on her job and her search overlap with each other. It's a really interesting novel with a background of various hardships common to many of the poorer people after the war, as well as touching on nuns living in a local Convent and on one particularly wealthy family. At the end of the book, Josephine's search finishes with a real twist.

Nature Notes

Here we are, the beginning of May. Spring is in full flow, but I just wish someone would tell the weather! Despite that there is always lots to see to brighten your day and lift your spirit. Earlier today Rachel said to me, “Turn around slowly and look at the gate,” and low and behold perched there was a beautiful female sparrowhawk. It stayed put and I was able to get some reasonable photos.

On 30th April, the common whitethroat that serenaded us last year was back with it's short scratchy song; maybe the same bird as last year, one of its offspring, or what, I don't know, but at least it is back heralding spring. On 2nd May I heard my first cuckoo at the back of Hardley Flood, when I was out with the dogs. It started to rain then the distant sound “cuckoo” heralded the iconic bird's presence.

I've already seen sand martins (brown above and white below, with a brown necklace) and I saw my first house martins over the Duck Pits between Hardley Staithe and the mill on 7th April (blue back above, white below with a white rump). There are other differences, often the colouration is not obvious, so look for the obvious white rump. Swallows came two days later and this year the saying “One swallow does not make it summer,” is definitely correct!

Out at Seething it was interesting to see almost daily quite a large flock of fieldfares almost to the end of April, hunting for food across fields. My biggest surprise was another winter migrant a brambling that was by our feeders the on the last sunday of April. Similar to a chaffinch but more orange than pink, but as it flew off it displayed its white rump which confirmed identification.

April also turned up two new birds for me in this area, within days, the first on 15th April, a great white egret, on the flooded field, viewable from Hardley Staithe carpark. Much larger than the more common little egret. It has an orange rather than black bill. Two days later there was a ringed ousel (which prefers mountain terrain) in the sheep field by the same car park, for several days.

The highlight of the month for me was discovering a little bunting at Surlingham Church Broad, a species I had never seen before. The dogs and I were returning along the boardwalk coming up to The Gun Club buildings when a small bird caught my eye skulking in the hedge. Fortunately, I decided to stop and investigate, and it obligingly came into view for a few seconds, giving me enough time to mentally take in its size and facial features, which enabled me to make the identification.

Our garden bird list increased by one when I heard an unfamiliar bird call, a flock of up to 25 whimbrel flying over. They landed in the water meadows behind the bungalow where they stayed for a few days “refueling” before continuing their migration northwards. These waders are similar to curlew in structure.

As lockdown is lifted and we can take advantage of the beautiful county we are fortunate to live in, keep your senses alert and see what surprises you.

Gardening Notes

From the Allotment

Looking forward to June this a very productive period and we should all be enjoying picking and eating (and freezing) the results of our hard work. All your more tender plants like the courgettes, squashes, and sweet potatoes should now be going in. It is difficult not to be tempted to plant early by warmer days in May, but June is best. Even so I will cover the sweet potatoes with straw and hold this down with fleece for a little longer. Sweet potatoes are hungry feeders so create a wide mound about 12 inches high and improve the soil with a generous addition of manure or compost. I buy them as slips and plant them deeply so that just the tips of the leaves are showing. Plants should be about 12 inches apart and rows 30 inches apart. You can also control the weeds by planting through black plastic.

If your potatoes suffered from late frosts and the tops are black, don't worry they'll soon recover.

Many books advise that courgettes and squashes can be planted in containers and if that's all you have then try it, but I have had poor results as they need a tremendous amount of water and liquid feed. In the ground they can find some of this for themselves. June is also the time for scrumptious home-grown soft fruit. They may not be so perfect as the supermarket ones, but they taste wonderful. And if you are organic, you know exactly what they have been sprayed with: Nothing!

From the Garden

June is a good time to enjoy your garden and plan for next year, and a number of plants can be grown now from seed to flower next spring. Wallflowers can be biannual or perennial and the seeds for the biannual varieties can be sown this month. They can be sown outside in a well prepared seedbed or inside in trays. Sowing in a tray inside is the best, once sown and watered place the tray in a propagator or polythene bag. The seeds should germinate between 10 - 21 days. I always date the label as I can never remember when I sowed the seed. Prick out into individual pots, pinch out the tops when they reach five inches tall as this will encourage bushy plants, plant out in late August. They are available in mixed colours or single colours like Fire King with scarlet blooms and a strong scent growing to 18 inches or Cloth of Gold, bright yellow and very fragrant, or Sugar Rush Purple with a sweet fragrance.

A very good perennial wallflower is Bowles Mauve, it is evergreen and requires full sun, flowering from late winter to late summer, regular deadheading is required from April onwards. It is a good wildlife plant especially for lacewings and hoverflies. The plants aren't long lived, but can be propagated by semi-hardwood cuttings in spring or summer.

I have compiled a list of gardens to visit this summer, hopefully without the need of an umbrella and wellies!
