It seemed that just as I was feeling low, I would get a card in the post letting me know someone was thinking of me and my family. A phone call would come at just the right moment from a friend and on the few

Sundays I have been able to get to church I have been overwhelmed with support. And a big thank you, to the person, and they know who they are, who would give me a big hug just as I was feeling very low. We should take time to appreciate or friends. As the saying goes 'a friend in need is a friend indeed.'




# **Evening Telephone Service on Sunday, July** 16th at 6:30pm


