Dear All

A prayer being answered means a new prayer is being asked.

Like so many of us, one of my prayers for the last few years has been that God brings more young families into our churches. Well, He is busy answering this prayer BUT now he needs us to help encourage and support them as I hope you agree.

Since Dallas retired, many of us have taken on new roles or have found existing ones have expanded somewhat- not least for our amazing church wardens and wonderful Readers and retired clergy! I perhaps have been given one of the most enviable of roles, to meet and greet folks who contact our churches asking for little ones to be baptised. It's a wonderful thing to do and a great privilege to go into folk's homes and chat with them about this decision and to have the opportunity to speak about our loving God with people whom God has called to us. You see how the prayer is being answered? There's no persuasion needed because they come wanting baptism and with what they describe as a special connection with our churches.



Over the next few months, we will be celebrating at least one baptism in each of our three churches and with the fabulous support from our baptism supporters, great advice from our retired clergy together with Dallas's sensible prior instruction and of course guidance from the Holy Spirit; we hope that the families coming are as prepared for this special event as they can be.

But baptism isn't an end but a beginning and in the service everyone is asked: 'will you support this child as he /she begins their journey of faith and will you help him/her to live and grow within God's family? To which we all enthusiastically respond with a loud 'we will' - and if we don't say it confidently enough - our clergy ask the question again until they are sure we have answered them well enough.



Our prayer has been for families to come to us BUT we promise at their baptisms to support and encourage them and God needs us to keep our promise. We can start fulfilling this each time we are in church by being welcoming and interested in the families attending and of course be accepting of the buzz that little ones naturally have - personally hearing them in church gives me goose bumps because their noise instantly reminds me that God is answering our prayer and that's a very powerful feeling! Simply saying hello and introducing ourselves can mean a lot and it so helps the new families to recognise a smiley face when they come another time. This is something they frequently tell me is so appreciated.

Having younger folks with us does mean we need to be more flexible with how we share worship. I appreciate this is a big ask, but however we are worshiping it's still God we are praising so the end result is the same and that's surely what matters most.

The other thing we all must recognise is that we are followers of Christ every day of the week and not just for an hour on a Sunday morning. This is something we try hard to get across to our baptism families and to help them find ways of acknowledging God in their day-to-day lives so their little ones are growing up daily in the knowledge and love of God. This is especially important as so many do find coming regularly to church on Sundays difficult for various reasons, not least due to work shift patterns and children's hobbies and activities which are often on a Sunday morning. This isn't to say that shared worship together isn't important or necessary for us all, but as churches we may have to think about how and when we come together to worship as Sunday morning is not the most convenient time for everyone.



Of course, whenever we are unsure of what steps to take, we can pray and ask God to lead us in the right direction and this is something everyone of us can do. So, my ask of us is that we are friendly and welcoming churches and we also pray for our baptism families and the little ones being baptised, we pray for help in supporting and encouraging them and we pray that we can adapt how and when we worship so they do have the opportunities

to be with us and share in the joy of worshiping our loving Father and together we can help his Kingdom Come.
