OCTOPUS, DRAGONFLIES AND TELESCOPES: Strange and amazing things!

When I first sat down to write this piece about a week ago, I didn't have a clue what subject to write about! So, for the last few days, I've been praying for inspiration. Not sure if the result is God-inspired or just the product of my (sometimes weird) thinking, I'll leave you to decide.....



I began, today at my computer, by looking at the National and International Awareness Day Calendar, just as I did once before when I ended up basing my piece around the theme of National Thank You Day. Well, October 8th turns out to be World Octopus Day which, initially, I didn't think was very helpful! I suppose these amazing creatures deserve a day, and given the name, it

was always going to be in 'Oct'ober. And I did learn a few fun facts about them – they have three hearts (I have enough trouble with just one!) and blue blood. Giant Pacific octopuses are the world's largest species growing from the size of a rice grain at birth to being fully grown within the space of just two years. The biggest recorded specimen had an arm span of 10 metres (33ft) and weighed 270kgs (600lbs).


As if octopuses are not strange and amazing enough creatures, something popped up on my phone notifications from BBC News. One of their Science Correspondents, Pallab Ghosh, had written an article titled 'Alien life in Universe: Scientists say finding it is 'only a matter

Suffice it to say, apparently many astronomers are no longer asking whether there is life elsewhere in the Universe. The question on their minds is instead: when will we find it? NASA's James Webb Space Telescope recently detected tantalising hints at life on a planet outside our Solar System – and it has many

more worlds in its sights. Whilst some look to distant planets, others are restricting their search to the planets of our own Solar System. They're looking at Jupiter and also sending a spacecraft called Dragonfly to land on Titan, one of the moons of Saturn.



So, I started with the octopus and here I was, in a rather roundabout route, now thinking about the dragonfly. Yet another strange and beautiful creature! This reminded me of a story which I'm sure some of you will know but bears repeating...

Once, in a little pond, in the muddy water under the lily pads, there lived a little water beetle in a community of water beetles. They lived a simple and comfortable life in

the pond with few disturbances and interruptions. Once in a while, sadness would come to the community when one of their fellow beetles would climb the stem of a lily pad and would never be seen again. They knew when this happened; their friend was dead, gone forever.

Then, one day, one little water beetle felt an irresistible urge to climb up that stem. However, he was determined that he would not leave forever. He would come back and tell his friends what he had found at the top. When he reached the top and climbed out of the water onto the surface of the lily pad, he was so tired, and the sun felt so warm, that he decided he must take a nap. As he slept, his body changed and when he woke up, he had turned into a beautiful blue-tailed dragonfly with broad wings and a slender body designed for flying. So, fly he did! And, as he soared, he saw the beauty of a whole new world and a far superior way of life to that he had ever known existed.



Then he remembered his beetle friends and how they were thinking by now he was dead. He wanted to go back to tell them and explain that he was now more alive than he had ever been before. His life had been fulfilled rather than ended. But his new body would not go down into the water. He could not get back to tell his friends the good news. Then he understood that their time would come, when they, too, would know what he now knew. So, he raised his wings and flew off into his joyous new life!

My thinking is that there are some fantastically intelligent people on this planet! Some of them are scientists employing their 'superbrains' in searching for an answer to some very big questions. Whilst I'm in awe of their skills and abilities, and find the results of their explorations fascinating, at the same time I'm happy to rely and rest on my faith, in the knowledge that God has ALL the answers and that He knows and loves ALL of us. Just like in the story of the dragonfly, one day, through the sacrifice of His only Son, He'll raise our wings and we'll fly off into a joyous new life!

The apostle Paul wrote to the church family at Corinth (1 Corinthians 13:12) just under 2,000 years ago, but he could have been writing with the same words to the NASA scientists today, with their amazingly powerful telescopes, when he said: 'For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part;



then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known.'




Midweek Holy Communion on the 18th October
