
Welcome to church today! We hope and pray that you will enjoy your time here and that you may encounter the presence of the living God.

Our Giving

The income across the four churches in the Parish, for March, was as follows:



Mar Jan to Mar

Collections / Giving: £7,728 £15,032
Other income: £1,724 £6,128
Total income: £6,452 £21,160

The deficit (excess of expenditure over income) for March is £5,601, but the deficit for the year is £8,687.

Important Notice:

I once again draw attention to our Parish finances. We have now experienced two lock-downs on the island where we have not been able to open our churches for Sunday Worship. This closure has a significant impact upon our Parish finances. The reduction in income is approximately £1000 for every Sunday we are closed! We are just beginning our third lock-down (which hopefully will be the last), however, if the same pattern of giving is maintained through this lock-down as it was for the two previous lockdowns, I estimate we will have a shortfall of £6000 by the end of March.

Consequently, to avoid a significant impact could I encourage you to consider the amount you give and the method by which you give. There are a number of ways that this can be done. The preferred way is to give by monthly Standing Order as this is a regular and sustainable way of giving, and allows the PCC to better manage the finances of your parish. 
St. Mary's: 2 vacancies St. Peter's: 1 vacancy

A reading from the book of Acts

When Peter saw it, he addressed the people, 'You Israelites, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we had made him walk? Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus according to Luke

Glory to you, O Lord!

While they were talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you.' They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. He said to them, 'Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet; see

that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have.' And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate in their presence.
