The Zoom link will also be sent, **this must be shared with Mothers' Union members only and not passed to anyone else.** The service will be hosted by St Nicholas Gosforth (as planned for 2020). The celebrant will be the Rev Jane Natrass Vicar of St Nicholas and Area Dean, Central Deanery. The preacher will be our Central Chaplain, the Rt. Rev. Emma Ineson, Bishop of Penrith. The Fishermen's Mission in North Shields Even though we can't meet up, it is wonderful to learn that our members are still helping to support vulnerable groups throughout the lockdown. At Christmas, Margaret Crawforth took warm thermal hats and biscuits for the fishermen at the fishermen's mission in North Shields. Since then we have heard of the hardship faced by the families of local fishermen. The centre itself is also in need of a tumble drier to help the overseas fishermen as they come to use the facilities at the centre. Generous donations from Mothers' Union members will allow a new tumble drier to be bought and some supplies bought for the fishermen's families as the need arises.

Freshstart backpacks for prisoners February 2021

Norma Willmott is still taking backpacks for some of the prisoners who are released from prison in Acklington. The problem for these prisoners is that they may have nowhere to go after discharge and, if they are banned by the courts to return to their previous location, they may be leaving with virtually nothing and not knowing where they will find accommodation (perhaps a hostel). This situation is much worse on a Friday or weekend, as by the time they reach their destination the probation and/or social security offices may be closed. MU were asked to help this relatively small group by providing them with a backpack containing a change of clothes and basic toiletries to tide them over until they get help at their destination. The pack itself is important, as all they are given by the prison is a black plastic sack. Whilst lockdown has made the usual collection of items to go in the backpacks very difficult, Norma has still managed to buy and fill the packs using cash donated by MU members. This year Norma has provided 18 packs for the prison. On behalf of the newly released prisoners, thank you.
